Protest Hearing on Annexation No. 303 to Los Angeles County Sanitation District No. 14

Agenda Item No. 3a

On August 23, 2006 your Commission approved a request initiated by Los Angeles County Sanitation District No. 14 to annex 19.943 acres of inhabited territory into the boundaries of District No. 14. The Protest Hearing before you today will satisfy the requirements of Government Code section 57000, *et seq.*

The annexation proposal is summarized as follows:

Proposal Area: The annexation consists of formerly vacant land being developed with 65 single-family homes, located within a residential community.

Population: The population is estimated at 184 residents.

Landowner: KB Home.

Topography, Natural Boundaries and Drainage Basins: Topography is flat.

Zoning, Present and Future Land Use: The current zoning is residential with a minimum lot size of 10,000 square feet.

Surrounding Land Use: Residential

Governmental Services and Control, Availability and Adequacy: The subject territory is not currently serviced by the District. However, the area was included in the future service area that might be served by the District and the District's future wastewater management needs were addressed in the Lancaster Water Reclamation Plant 2020 Facilities Plan. The wastewater generated by the proposed project will be treated at the Lancaster Water Reclamation Plant (LWRP). The District will have adequate capacity to collect, treat and dispose of the wastewater anticipated to be generated by the subject territory.

Effects on agricultural or open-space lands: The proposal will not have an effect on agricultural or open space lands.

Boundaries and Lines of Assessment: The boundary of the proposed annexation conforms to the recorded lines of assessment.

Sphere of Influence: The subject territory is within the sphere of influence of District No. 14.

Tax Resolution: All affected agencies adopted a negotiated tax exchange resolution.

CEQA: Acting as a responsible agency, the Commission considered and adopted the negative declaration adopted by the City of Lancaster, as lead agency, as being adequate for approval of this proposal.

Correspondence: No correspondence has been received.

Recommended Action

2. Close protest hearing.
3. Instruct the Executive Officer, pursuant to Government Code Section 57075, to determine the value of protests filed and not withdrawn and report back to the Commission with the results.

WHEREAS, the Los Angeles County Sanitation District No. 14 filed an application to initiate proceedings before the Local Agency Formation Commission for Los Angeles County (the "Commission") pursuant to Part 3, Division 3, Title 5 of the California Government Code (commencing with section 56000, the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000), for the annexation of territory to the Los Angeles County Sanitation District No. 14; and

WHEREAS, the principal reason for the proposed annexation is to provide offsite sewage disposal for the development of 65 proposed single-family homes; and

WHEREAS, a description of the boundaries and map of the proposal is set forth in Exhibits "A" and "B," attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the territory consists of 19.943 acres and is inhabited; and

WHEREAS, the short-form designation given this proposal is "Annexation No. 303"; and

WHEREAS, on August 23, 2006, the Commission approved Annexation No.14-303; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 57002, the Executive Officer of the Commission has set October 11, 2006 as the date for the protest hearing and has given notice thereof; and

WHEREAS, at the time and place fixed in the notice, the hearing was held, and any and all oral or written protests, objections and evidence were received and considered; and

WHEREAS, the Commission, acting as the conducting authority, has the ministerial duty of tabulating the value of protests filed and not withdrawn and either terminating these proceedings if a majority protest exists or ordering the annexation directly or subject to confirmation by the registered

voters.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

1. The Commission finds that the number of registered voters within the boundary of the territory is 17 and the number of property owners is ____.
2. The Commission finds that the number of written protests filed in opposition to Annexation No. 14-303 and not withdrawn is ____, which, even if valid, represents less than 25 percent of the number of registered voters residing within the boundaries of the affected territory, and less than 25 percent of the number of owners of land who also own at least 25 percent of the assessed value of land within the affected territory.
3. The Commission hereby orders the annexation of the territory described in Exhibit "A" hereto, to the Los Angeles County Sanitation District No. 14.
4. Pursuant to Government Code section 56886, the annexation shall be subject to the following terms and conditions:
 - a. The territory so annexed shall be subject to the payment of such service charges, assessments or taxes as the Los Angeles County Sanitation District No. 14 may legally impose.
 - b. The regular County assessment roll shall be utilized by the Los Angeles County Sanitation District No. 14.

Protest Hearing on Annexation No. 304 to Los Angeles County Sanitation District No. 14

Agenda Item No. 3b

On August 23, 2006 your Commission approved a request initiated by Los Angeles County Sanitation District No. 14 to annex 12.488 acres of inhabited territory into the boundaries of District No. 14. The Protest Hearing before you today will satisfy the requirements of Government Code section 57000, *et seq.*

The annexation proposal is summarized as follows:

Proposal Area: The annexation consists of 10 single-family homes located within a residential community. The territory is also being developed to include one proposed single-family home.

Population: The population is estimated at 25 residents.

Landowner: There are numerous owners of record.

Topography, Natural Boundaries and Drainage Basins: Topography is flat.

Zoning, Present and Future Land Use: The current zoning is light agriculture with a minimum lot size of 10,000 square feet. The territory is being developed to include one proposed single-family home.

Surrounding Land Use: Residential

Governmental Services and Control, Availability and Adequacy: The subject territory is not currently serviced by the District. However, the area was included in the future service area that might be served by the District and the District's future wastewater management needs were addressed in the Lancaster Water Reclamation Plant 2020 Facilities Plan. The wastewater generated by the proposed project will be treated at the Lancaster Water Reclamation Plant (LWRP). The District will have adequate capacity to collect, treat and dispose of the wastewater anticipated to be generated by the subject territory.

Effects on agricultural or open-space lands: Although the territory is zoned light agriculture, single-family residences are a permitted use and the area is primarily in a residential community. The proposal will not have an effect on agricultural or open space lands.

Boundaries and Lines of Assessment: The boundary of the proposed annexation conforms to the recorded lines of assessment.

Sphere of Influence: The subject territory is within the sphere of influence of District No. 14.

Tax Resolution: All affected agencies have adopted a negotiated tax exchange resolution.

CEQA: The Commission determined that the project is exempt from the provisions of CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15319(a), because it is an annexation containing existing structures developed to the density allowed by the current zoning for the ten existing single-family homes. The Commission further determined that the project is exempt from the provisions of CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15303(a) for the proposed one single-family home because it consists of the construction of one single-family residence in a residential zone.

Correspondence: No correspondence has been received.

Recommended Action

1. Open the protest hearing and receive written protests.
2. Close protest hearing.
3. Instruct the Executive Officer, pursuant to Government Code Section 57075, to determine the value of protests filed and not withdrawn and report back to the Commission with the results.
4. Based upon the results of the protest hearing either adopt a resolution terminating the annexation proceedings if a majority protest exists, ordering Annexation 304 to Los Angeles County Sanitation District No. 14 directly or ordering the annexation subject to confirmation by the registered voters of the affected territory.

**Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 37
Annexation No. 2006-30**

The proposal before you is a request to annex uninhabited territory into the boundary of the Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 37.

Proposal Area: The project site consists of 17.5± acres of vacant land.

Location: The site is generally located near the intersection of Berncastle Road and Forrest Spring Road within unincorporated county territory.

Factors to be Considered Pursuant to Government Code Section 56668:

1. *Population:* The current population is 0.
2. *Landowner:* Ara Rostam.
3. *Topography, Natural Boundaries and Drainage Basins:* The terrain is sloping hillside, with no natural boundaries.
4. *Zoning, Present and Future Land Use:* The present the land use is vacant and future use will consist of one single-family dwelling and is zoned as Non Urban I.
5. *Surrounding Land Use:* There are residential populations to the east, west and south.
6. *Assessed Value:* The total assessed value is \$140,000.
7. *Governmental Services and Control, Availability and Adequacy:*
If and when the land is developed as proposed, the County of Los Angeles will provide services as outlined in the County's Supplemental District Guidelines and General Plan for the Acton area.
8. *Water Availability:*
The District has sufficient water supply to meet the needs of the proposal area. The landowner will build the water system, to the District's specifications, and interconnect with an existing water main. The system will eventually be dedicated to the District.

9. *Effects on agricultural or open-space lands:* There are no agricultural or open space lands within the proposal area.
10. *Boundaries and Lines of Assessment:* The boundary of the proposed annexation conforms to recorded lines of assessment.
11. *Sphere of Influence:* The subject territory is within the sphere of influence of Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 37.
12. *Tax Resolution:* All affected agencies have adopted a negotiated tax exchange resolution.
13. *Correspondence:* No correspondence has been received.

Alternate Course of Action:

There are no alternate courses of action. If the annexation is denied the project would not proceed.

CEQA: In accordance with the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), an initial study and negative declaration were prepared and circulated for review beginning September 20, 2006. The review period will end on October 10, 2006. Your Commission, acting as lead agency, must consider and adopt the Negative Declaration before it approves this proposal. Comments received, if any, will be provided to your Commission for its consideration along with the Negative Declaration. No comments have been received to date. A fee must be paid to the State Department of Fish and Game when certain notices required by CEQA are filed with the County Clerk. The fee does not have to be paid upon a finding by your Commission that the proposal will have no adverse impact on wildlife resources. The initial study has determined that the proposal will not have any adverse impact on wildlife resources.

Waiver of Notice and Hearing: Pursuant to Government Code Section 56663(a) all owners of land within the affected territory have consented to the change of organization and have requested that the Commission makes its determination without notice and hearing. To date, no subject agency has submitted written demand for notice and hearing on this application.

Waiver of Protest Hearing: Pursuant to Government Code Section 56663(c) all owners of land within the affected territory have consented to the change of organization. To date, the subject agencies have not submitted written opposition to waiver of the protest proceedings.

Conclusion: The subject territory will be developed with one single-family home. Annexation will allow future residents to receive a reliable source of water.

Recommended Action:

1. Waive Notice and Hearing requirements for this application pursuant to Government Code section 56663(a).
2. Consider the Negative Declaration, together with any comments received during the public review process, find that the proposal will not have a significant effect on the environment, find that the Negative Declaration reflects the independent judgment of the Commission, and adopt the Negative Declaration.
3. Find that the proposal will have no adverse effect on wildlife resources and authorize the Executive Officer to complete and file a Certificate of Fee Exemption for the proposal. .
4. Adopt Resolution Making Determinations Approving and Ordering Annexation No. 2006-30 to Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 37.

WHEREAS, the Executive Officer has reviewed the proposal and submitted to the Commission a report, including his recommendations therein; and

WHEREAS, on October 11, 2006, at its regular meeting, this Commission considered the proposal and the report of the Executive Officer, along with public comment on the proposal.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

1. Pursuant to Government Code Section 56663(a), the Commission hereby finds and determines that:
 - a. All owners of land within the affected territory have given their written consent to the change of organization; and
 - b. No subject agency has submitted written opposition to a waiver of notice and hearing requirements.

Based thereon, notice and hearing requirements are waived.

2. The Commission, acting in its role as lead agency with respect to Annexation 2006-30 to Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 37, pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15074(b), has considered the Negative Declaration, together with any comments received during the public review process, finds that the proposal will not have a significant effect on the environment, finds that the Negative Declaration reflects the independent judgment of the Commission, and has adopted the Negative Declaration prepared for this proposal.
3. A description of the boundaries and map of the proposal as approved by this Commission is set forth in Exhibits "A" and "B" attached hereto, and by this reference incorporated herein.

4. The Commission hereby approves the annexation subject to the following terms and conditions:
 - a. The territory so annexed shall be subject to the payment of such service charges, assessments or taxes as the Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 37 may legally impose.
 - b. The regular County assessment roll is utilized by the Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 37.
 - c. The territory will not be taxed for existing bonded indebtedness of the Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 40.

5. Pursuant to Government Code Section 56663(c), the Commission hereby finds and determines that:
 - a. The territory to be annexed is uninhabited;
 - b. All owners of land within the affected territory have given their written consent to the change of organization; and
 - c. No subject agency has submitted written opposition to a waiver of protest proceedings.Based thereon, protest proceedings are waived.

GOVERNMENT CODE § 56857 NOTICES

(For Informational Purposes Only, Receive and File)

Upon receipt of any proposed change of organization or reorganization that includes the annexation of territory to any district, if the proposal is not filed by the district to which annexation of territory is proposed, Government Code section 56857 requires LAFCO to place the proposal on its agenda for informational purposes only. Within 60 days of the meeting date, the annexing district may adopt and submit to LAFCO a resolution requesting termination of the annexation proceedings. The law requires that the annexing district "present written findings supported by substantial evidence in the record that the termination request is justified by a financial or service related concern." Prior to the Commission's determination of termination of proceedings the resolution is subject to judicial review.

Waiver of 60-Day Termination Period

Under section 56857, LAFCO may not hear and consider the proposed annexation until the 60-day termination period has expired. The Code provides, however, that the Commission may waive the 60-day termination period if the annexing district adopts and submits to LAFCO a resolution supporting the change of organization or reorganization.

The following is a summary of the annexation proposals filed with LAFCO:

a. *Project Description – Annexation No. 2006-37*

Project Location – Located in unincorporated Los Angeles County east of Interstate 5 and south of Towsley Canyon road along the Old Road.

b. *Project Description – Annexation 2006-38*

Project Location – Generally located in on 20th Street East and Avenue H all within the City of Lancaster.
