FACTORS TO BE CONSIDERED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE 56668:

a. Population:

The existing population is 239 residents as of March 29, 2013 (estimated population of the probation camp at the time of application). The population density is .50 persons per acre.

The estimated future population is 239 residents.

The affected territory is 475.28+/- acres. The existing land use consists of a youth probation camp, a golf course, a tree farm, and two equestrian centers.

The assessed valuation is \$4,267,393 as of March 29, 2013. The per capita assessed valuation is \$17,855.20. On August 6, 2013, the County adopted a zero tax exchange resolution; on March 27, 2013 County Sanitation District No. 21 adopted a zero tax exchange resolution.

The topography of the affected territory is flat to slightly sloping.

The affected territory is bounded by Angeles National Forest. Live Oak Debris Basin is located east and south of the annexation.

The nearest populated areas are 200 feet to the west and 500 feet to the south of the affected territory. The affected territory is likely to experience no growth in the next ten years. The adjacent areas are likely to experience no growth in the next ten years.

b. Governmental Services and Controls:

The affected territory includes a youth probation camp, a golf course, a tree farm, and two equestrian centers which requires organized governmental services. The affected territory will require governmental services indefinitely.

The present cost and adequacy of governmental services and controls in the area are acceptable. With respect to sanitary sewage disposal, other than service provided by the District, the only alternative is private septic systems. The cost of sewage disposal by the District versus the cost by septic system is subject to multiple factors and varies widely. Service by the District is considered to be more reliable than septic systems. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

c. Proposed Action and Alternative Actions:

The proposed action will have no effect on mutual social and economic interests. The proposal has no impact on the local governmental structure of the County.

The only alternate action for sewage disposal is a private septic system. Service by the District is considered to be more reliable than septic systems. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

d. Conformity with Commission Policies on Urban Development and Open Space Conversion Policies:

There are no conformance issues because the Commission has not adopted any policies relative to providing planned, orderly, efficient patterns of urban development.

There is no prime agricultural land within or adjacent to the affected territory. The proposal conforms with the objectives in Government Code Sections 56377(a) and 56377(b).

The affected territory consists of a youth probation camp, a golf course, a tree farm, and two equestrian centers. All of these existing uses, or portions thereof, include areas that could be considered as open space. The proposal, to provide sanitary sewer service to these existing facilities, would not facilitate the conversion of open space to other uses. All of the property is owned by the County of Los Angeles and remains in long-term public or semi-public uses.

e. Agricultural Lands:

A portion of the affected territory is currently used for agricultural purposes (the two tree farms). The proposal, to provide sanitary sewer service to the affected territory, will not have an impact on the continued operation of the tree farms.

f. Boundaries:

The boundaries of the affected territory have been clearly defined by the applicant, and these boundaries have been reviewed and approved by LAFCO's GIS/Mapping Technician.

The boundaries conform to lines of assessment or ownership, and these boundaries have been reviewed and approved by LAFCO's GIS/Mapping Technician.

As a special district annexation, the proposal has no impact on existing city-county boundaries, nor does it create islands or corridors of unincorporated territory.

g. Consistency with Plans:

The proposal has no significant impact upon, and is therefore consistent with, the Regional Transportation Plan.

The proposal is consistent with the existing County General Plan designation of Open Space (OS).

The affected territory is not within the boundaries of any Specific Plan.

Pre-zoning is not a requirement for a special district proposal.

h. Sphere of Influence:

The affected territory is within the Sphere of Influence of the Los Angeles County Sanitation District No. 21.

i. Comments from Public Agencies:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from public agencies or any resolutions raising objections from any affected agency.

j. Ability to Provide Services:

The affected territory is already being serviced by the District. The area was included in the future service area that might be served by the District. The District's future wastewater management needs were addressed in the Joint Outfall System 2010 Master Facilities Plan.

k. Timely Availability of Water Supplies:

There are no known issues regarding water supply or delivery.

l. Regional Housing:

As a special district annexation, the proposal will not affect any city, nor the county, in achieving their respective fair shares of the regional housing needs as determined by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG).

m. Comments from Landowners, Voters, or Residents:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from landowners, voters, or residents.

n. Land Use Designations

The proposal is consistent with the existing County General Plan designation of Open Space (OS).

The proposal is consistent with the existing County zoning designation of Open Space (OS).

o. Environmental Justice:

All of the owners of real property within the affected territory have requested, in writing, that the District provide off-site sewage disposal service. Property-owners of adjacent areas did not request such service, and/or were contacted by Sanitation District staff and were not interested in securing such service or did not respond. The proposal promotes environmental justice, in that there is fair treatment of people of all races, cultures, and incomes with respect to the location of public facilities and the provision of public services.

There are no Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities (DUCs) within or adjacent to the affected territory.

CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) CLEARANCE:

The proposal is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15302(c) because the project consists of replacement or reconstruction of existing utility systems and/or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of capacity. The Categorical Exemption was adopted by Los Angeles County Sanitation District No. 21, as lead agency, on March 27, 2013.

<u>DETERMINATIONS WITHOUT NOTICE AND HEARING, AND WAIVER OF</u> PROTEST PROCEEDINGS:

Pursuant to Government Code Section 56662(a), the Commission may make determinations upon the proposed annexation without notice and hearing and may waive protest hearings for the reasons set forth herein. The territory is uninhabited. To date, no affected local agency has submitted a written demand for notice and hearing during the 10-day period referenced in Government Code Section 56662(c). Furthermore, the proposal was accompanied by satisfactory proof that all the landowners within the affected territory have given their written consent to the proposed annexation. Based thereon, the Commission may make determinations on the proposed annexation without notice and hearing, and the Commission may waive protest proceedings.

CONCLUSION:





FACTORS TO BE CONSIDERED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE 56668:

a. Population:

The existing population is 0 residents as of June 24, 2013. The population density issue does not apply because the affected territory is unpopulated.

The estimated future population is 0 residents.

The affected territory is 197.956+/- acres. The existing land consists of vacant land within a residential area. The proposed/future land use is a proposed high school.

The assessed valuation is \$1,178,683 as of June 24, 2013. The per capita assessed valuation issue does not apply because the affected territory is unpopulated. On August 6, 2013, the County adopted a negotiated tax exchange resolution; all other involved public agencies have adopted a property tax transfer resolution.

The topography of the affected territory is fairly hilly terrain bisected by two parallel north-south trending canyons.

To the North and East of the affected territory is Castaic Lake; Smith and Romero Canyon are located to the south of the affected territory. There are no drainage basins on or near the affected territory.

The nearest populated area is 1,500 feet to the south of the affected territory. The affected territory is likely to experience modest growth in the next ten years. The adjacent areas are likely to experience modest growth in the next ten years.

b. Governmental Services and Controls:

The affected territory will be developed to include a proposed high school which requires organized governmental services. The affected territory will require governmental services indefinitely.

The present cost and adequacy of governmental services and controls in the area are acceptable. With respect to sanitary sewage disposal, other than service provided by the District, the only alternative is private septic systems. The cost of sewage disposal by the District versus the cost by septic system is subject to multiple factors and varies widely. Service by the District is considered to be more reliable than septic systems. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

c. Proposed Action and Alternative Actions:

The proposed action will have no effect on mutual social and economic interests. The proposal has no impact on the local governmental structure of the County.

The only alternate action for sewage disposal is a private septic system. Service by the District is considered to be more reliable than septic systems. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

d. Conformity with Commission Policies on Urban Development and Open Space Conversion Policies:

There are no conformance issues because the Commission has not adopted any policies relative to providing planned, orderly, efficient patterns of urban development.

There is no prime agricultural land within or adjacent to the affected territory. The proposal conforms with the objectives in Government Code Sections 56377(a) and 56377(b).

e. Agricultural Lands:

There are no effects on agricultural lands, as defined. None of the land within the affected territory is currently used for the purpose of producing an agricultural commodity for commercial purposes. According to the California Department of Conservation, Division of Land Resource Protection, none of the land within the affected territory is subject to a Land Conservation Act (aka "Williamson Act") contract nor in a Farmland Security Zone (California Land Conservation Act 2012 Status Report).

f. Boundaries:

The boundaries of the affected territory have been clearly defined by the applicant, and these boundaries have been reviewed and approved by LAFCO's GIS/Mapping Technician.

The boundaries conform to lines of assessment or ownership, and these boundaries have been reviewed and approved by LAFCO's GIS/Mapping Technician.

As a special district annexation, the proposal has no impact on existing city-county boundaries, nor does it create islands or corridors of unincorporated territory.

g. Consistency with Plans:

The proposal has no significant impact upon, and is therefore consistent with, the Regional Transportation Plan.

The existing County General Plan designation is Rural Land (RL2).

The affected territory is not within the boundaries of any Specific Plan.

The landowner is the William S. Hart Union High School District, which is developing the proposed high school. As a state agency, the District is exempt from local General Plan and zoning requirements.

Pre-zoning is not a requirement for a special district proposal.

h. Sphere of Influence:

The affected territory is within the Sphere of Influence of the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County.

i. Comments from Public Agencies:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from public agencies or any resolutions raising objections from any affected agency.

j. Ability to Provide Services:

The affected territory is not currently serviced by the District, the area was included in the future service area that might be served by the District. The District's future wastewater management needs were addressed in the 2015 Santa Clarita Valley Joint Sewerage System Facilities Plan and EIR.

k. Timely Availability of Water Supplies:

There are no known issues regarding water supply or delivery.

l. Regional Housing:

As a special district annexation, the proposal will not affect any city, nor the county, in achieving their respective fair shares of the regional housing needs as determined by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG).

m. Comments from Landowners, Voters, or Residents:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from landowners, voters, or residents.

n. Land Use Designations

The existing County General Plan designation is Rural Land (RL2).

The existing County zoning designation is Heavy Agricultural 2.

The landowner is the William S. Hart Union High School District, which is developing the proposed high school. As a state agency, the District is exempt from local General Plan and zoning requirements

o. Environmental Justice:

All of the owners of real property within the affected territory have requested, in writing, that the District provide off-site sewage disposal service. Property-owners of adjacent areas did not request such service, and/or were contacted by Sanitation District staff and were not interested in securing such service or did not respond. The proposal promotes environmental justice, in that there is fair treatment of people of all races, cultures, and incomes with respect to the location of public facilities and the provision of public services.

There are no Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities (DUCs) within or adjacent to the affected territory.

CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) CLEARANCE:

The CEQA clearance is an Environmental Impact Report adopted by the William S. Hart Union High School District, as lead agency, on June 19, 2013. Acting in its role as a responsible agency, and with respect to Annexation No. 1066, and under State CEQA Guidelines Section 15096, the Commission certifies that it has independently considered and reached its own conclusions regarding the environmental effects of the project and the Environmental Impact Report adopted by the William S. Hart Union High School District, and has determined that the document adequately addresses the environmental impacts of the project. The Commission also finds that it has complied with the requirements of CEQA with respect to the process for a responsible agency, and hereby adopts by reference the environmental findings, including the Statement of Overriding Considerations, and the Mitigation Monitoring Program previously adopted by the lead agency in connection with its approval of the project.

<u>DETERMINATIONS WITHOUT NOTICE AND HEARING, AND WAIVER OF PROTEST PROCEEDINGS:</u>

Pursuant to Government Code Section 56662(a), the Commission may make determinations upon the proposed annexation without notice and hearing and may waive protest hearings for the reasons set forth herein. The territory is uninhabited. To date, no affected local agency has submitted a written demand for notice and hearing during the 10-day period referenced in Government Code Section 56662(c). Furthermore, the proposal was accompanied by satisfactory proof that all the landowners within the affected territory have given their written consent to the proposed annexation. Based thereon, the Commission may make determinations on the proposed annexation without notice and hearing, and the Commission may waive protest proceedings.

CONCLUSION:



Alternate to the Public Member Vacancy

Government Code Section 56331 provides that the Commission "may . . . appoint one alternate public member who may serve and vote in place of a regular public member who is absent or who disqualifies himself or herself from participating in a meeting of the commission." The Commission appointment of Gerard McCallum to serve as the Public Member creates a vacancy in the position of Alternate Public Member.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 56325(d), LAFCO is required to post a notice of vacancy regarding the Alternate Public Member position, and, further, to send copies of the notice of vacancy to the legislative body of each local agency within the county. An appointment to fill the vacancy cannot be made until at least 21 days after the notice of vacancy is posted. Government Code Section 56325(d) provides that selection of the Alternate Public Member requires the affirmative vote of at least one of the members selected by each of the other appointing authorities.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 56331, the Alternate Public Member may not be an officer or employee of the County of Los Angeles or any city or special district within the County. In addition to this statutory restriction, and consistent with the intent of Government Code Section 56331, staff recommends that the Notice of Vacancy include the additional restriction that the Alternate Public Member may not be an appointee of the County of Los Angeles or any city or special district within the County. Both of these restrictions would apply at the time of appointment, meaning that applicants who indicate an intent to resign or retire from their office, employment, or appointment could be considered by the Commission.

Subject to any changes resulting from your input, staff recommends that the Commission adopt the following process to appoint the Alternate to the Public Member, which includes outreach efforts similar to those previously conducted by the Commission:

- Direct staff to mail the Notice of Vacancy of Alternate Public Member and Application for Appointment to the County of Los Angeles, all cities in the County, and all independent special districts in the County;
- Direct staff to post the Notice of Vacancy on the Commission's web-site;
- Issue a press release announcing the vacancy and distribute to media organizations;
- Mail or e-mail copies of the notice and application to:

- County of Los Angeles Department of Regional Planning's public hearing notification list, if available:
- Los Angeles County Librarian, with a request to post the notice on billboards in all County public libraries;
- City of Los Angeles Department of Neighborhood Empowerment ("DONE")
 Neighborhood Council database, if available
- Business-related organizations, such as chambers of commerce and economic development associations;
- Southern California Association of Governments ("SCAG") and the regional Councils of Government (COGs); and
- Any other groups or individuals, as determined by the Executive Officer, who may have an interest in the position or may assist in publicizing the vacancy.
- Appoint an-Hoc Committee of the Commission of up to four members to screen the initial round of applicants, and make recommendations for a group of no more than 8 finalists for consideration by the Commission;
- Interview of the finalists by the Commission; and
- Nominate and appoint an Alternate Public Member to serve out the remaining term of former Alternate Public Member, Commissioner Gerard McCallum, which expires on May 2, 2016.

Staff is proposing the following schedule:

July 14, 2014 Issue Notice of Vacancy of Alternate Public Member

September 8, 2014 Deadline for submittal of applications

September, 2014 Ad Hoc Committee identifies finalists

October 8, 2014 Commission interviews finalists

or

October 22, 2014

November 12, 2014 Commission nominates and appoints Alternate to the Public Member

With respect to interviews of the finalists, staff needs direction regarding whether the interviews should occur at the Commission's regular meeting of October 8th or a special meeting of October 22nd. Three years ago, when Commissioner McCallum was appointed, the Commission scheduled a special meeting to interview the six finalists.

Staff recommends that the Commission:

- 1. Direct the Executive Officer to post the Notice of Vacancy of Alternate Public Member and mail the Notice of Vacancy and Application for Appointment to the County of Los Angeles, all cities in the County, and all independent special districts in the County;
- 2. Direct the Executive Officer to publicize the Alternate Public Member vacancy as described in this staff report; and
- 3. Authorize the Chair to appoint a 4-member Ad Hoc Committee of the Commission to screen the initial round of applicants, and make recommendations for a group of no more than 8 finalists for consideration by the Commission; and
- 4. Direct staff to agendize the interview of finalists for the Regular Meeting of the Commission on Wednesday, October 8th, 2014, or a Special Meeting on Wednesday, October 22nd, 2014;
- 5. Nominate and elect an Alternate Public Member at your meeting of Wednesday, November 12th.
