The E.O. stated that pursuant to the Commission recommendation, staff has conducted exhaustive public outreach associated with the Alternate Public Member recruitment process. which includes contacting public agencies, issuing a press release, and e-mailing or mailing announcements to homeowner associations, chambers of commerce, and civic associations. The

deadline to submit applications is Monday, September 8, 2014. As of August 12th, staff has received 17 applications. The E.O. anticipates receiving over 20 applications by September 8th.

The E.O. stated that there are two items in the recommendation; one, that the Commission direct the Executive Officer to schedule a meeting of the Ad Hoc Committee for the Alternate Public Member so the Committee can meet, review applications, and narrow down applicants to no more than 8 finalists; and two, direct the Executive Officer to schedule interviews with the finalists at the regular meeting of October 8th or at a Special Meeting on October 22nd.

Chair Gladbach appointed three Members of the Ad Hoc Committee for the selection of an Alternate Public Member: Commissioner Spence (City), Supervisor Knabe (County), and Commissioner McCallum (Public). Mr. Gladbach (Special District) will chair the Ad Hoc Committee formed for this purpose.

Request for Exemption from LAFCO Approval of an Out-of-Agency Service Agreement between the La Habra Utility Authority and the La Habra Heights County Water District (Government Code Section 56133(e)) No. 2014-08

This is a request by the California Domestic Water Company for the Commission to determine that an out-of-agency service agreement between the La Habra Utility Authority and the La Habra Heights County Water District for the provision of retail water service ("Agreement") is exempt from Commission approval of pursuant to Government Code Section 56133 ("Proposal").

Pursuant to subdivision (e) of Government Code Section 56133, an out-of-agency service contract or agreement does not require approval from the Commission if it involves:

- Contracts or agreements solely involving two or more public agencies where the public service to be provided is an alternative to, or substitute for, public services already being provided by an existing public service provider and where the level of service to be provided is consistent with the level of service contemplated by the existing service provider; or
- Contracts for the transfer of non-potable or non-treated water; or
- Contracts or agreements solely involving the provision of surplus water to agriculture land or facilities; or
- Extended service that a city or district was providing on or before January 1, 2001; or
- A local publicly owned electric utility providing electric services that do not involve the acquisition, construction, or installation of electric distribution facilities by the local publicly owned electric utility, outside of the utility's jurisdictional boundaries.

The Commission is being asked to determine that the Proposal is exempt from the requirements of Government Code Section 56133 pursuant to the exemptions found in subdivision (e) and summarized above.

<u>Purpose / Background:</u> The California Domestic Water Company, a private water company, currently provides retail water service to customers whose property is located within the boundaries of unincorporated Los Angeles County and the City of La Habra Heights ("affected territory"). The Proposal contemplates that La Habra Utility Authority, in Orange County, will

now provide water service to the affected territory.

Location: The affected territory is all within the County of Los Angeles. A portion is located within unincorporated Los Angeles County territory, and a portion is within the City of La Habra Heights. The affected territory consists of a total of 81.85± acres of inhabited territory, composed of two non-contiguous areas. Area 1 (79.25± acres) consists of a total of 215 service connections. Of the 215 service connections, 198 connections are located within Los Angeles County unincorporated territory, and 17 service connections are located within the City of La Habra Heights. Area 2 (2.60± acres) consists of 4 service connections, and it is located southeast of the City of La Habra Heights, in unincorporated Los Angeles County territory. The affected territory is composed of 219 single-family dwellings, 2 parks, 1 retention basin, and 1 sewer lift station.

Sphere of Influence: Area 1 is within the boundaries and Sphere of Influence (SOI) of the La Habra Heights County Water District. Area 2 is within the boundaries and SOI of the Rowland Water District. No Sphere of Influence amendments are required.

CEQA: The Proposal is not a project pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because it is an activity that is excluded from the definition of a project by Section 15378(b) of the State CEQA Guidelines. This proposal is an administrative activity of government which will not result in direct or indirect physical changes to the environment

<u>Analysis:</u> This exemption from Commission approval under subdivision (e) of Government Code Section 56133, involves several components:

- Contracts or agreements solely involving two or more public agencies. The definition of a "public agency" in Government Code Section 56070 includes both a special district and a Joint Powers Authority (JPA). The La Habra Heights County Water District is a county water district, established in 1976 pursuant to Section 30000 of the Water Code, serving 1,970 customers in the City of La Habra Heights and small portions of the City of Whittier and unincorporated Los Angeles County. The La Habra Utility Authority is a JPA, formed under Government Code Section 6500 et seq., the members of which include the City of La Habra and the La Habra Housing Authority. The La Habra Utility Authority was established in 2007 and provides retail water service to 13,542 customers in the City of La Habra. Attached as Exhibit "A" is an Agreement, dated July 8, 2014, between the La Habra Utility Authority and the La Habra Heights County Water District. The La Habra Utility Authority approved the Agreement on July 15, 2014. The Board of Directors of the La Habra Heights County Water District approved the Agreement at its meeting of July 8, 2014. Staff has determined that the record supports a finding that the Agreement is between two public agencies.
- The public service to be provided is an alternative to, or substitute for, public services already being provided by an existing public service provider. The California Domestic Water Company currently provides retail water service to customers in the affected

territory. The La Habra Utility Authority currently provides retail water service to customers within the City of La Habra (immediately adjacent to the affected territory, within Orange County). Staff has determined that the record supports a finding that proposed services to be provided to the affected territory by the La Habra Utility Authority under the Agreement are a substitute for services currently being provided by a public service provider, the California Domestic Water Company.

• The level of service to be provided is consistent with the level of service contemplated by the existing service provider. The La Habra Utility Authority currently provides retail water service to 13,542 customers within the City of La Habra. The addition of 219 service connections in the affected territory represents a modest increase of less than 2 percent above the customers already being served by the La Habra Utility Authority.

Attached as Exhibit "B" is a letter, from the City of La Habra's Public Works Director (Elias Saykali, P.E.), which states:

"It is . . . my professional opinion that the level of service that will be provided by the Authority after the contemplated transfer is completed will be consistent with the level of service now being provided by Cal. Domestic. It is my further professional opinion that upon completion of the planned water system improvements, the level of service the Authority will provide will be significantly improved as compared to the existing level of service."


Based upon this information, staff has determined that the record supports a finding that the level of service to be provided by the La Habra Utility Authority is consistent with the level of service currently provided by the existing service provider, the California Domestic Water Company.


Conclusion: Staff has reviewed documentation provided by the applicant and concludes that the Proposal supports a finding that it meets the criteria for an exemption from Commission approval as set forth in subdivision (e) of Government Code Section 56133.

Recommended Action:


- 1. Open the public hearing and receive testimony on the Request for Exemption;
- 2. There being no further testimony, close the public hearing;
- 3. Find that the Proposal is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA);
- 4. Find that the Agreement between the La Habra Utility Authority and the La Habra Heights County Water District (Exhibit "A") is an agreement solely between two public agencies;

- 5. Find that the retail water service to be provided by the La Habra Utility Authority is an alternative to, or substitute for, water service already being provided by an existing public service provider, the California Domestic Water Company;
- 6. Find that the level of retail water service to be provided by the La Habra Utility Authority is consistent with the level of service currently being provided by an existing public service provider, the California Domestic Water Company (Exhibit "B");
- 7. Determine that the Agreement between the La Habra Utility Authority and the La Habra Heights County Water District does not require LAFCO approval under Government Code Section 56133 because the Agreement falls within the exemption set forth in subdivision (e);
- 8. Revise LAFCO's La Habra Heights County Water District Map to indicate that Area 1 is serviced by the La Habra Utility Authority; and
- 9. Revise LAFCO's Rowland Water District Map to indicate that Area 2 is serviced by the La Habra Utility Authority.

Utility Authority/La Habra Heights County Water District Out-of-Agency Service Agreement from LAFCO Approval

Dear Mr. Novak:

Thank you for forwarding the July 23, 2014 letter from James Ciampa, legal counsel for California Domestic Water Company ("CDWC"), requesting an exemption from approval by Los Angeles County LAFCO ("LA LAFCO") of an out-of-agency service agreement between the La Habra Utility Authority ("Authority") and La Habra Heights County Water District ("LHHCWD") pursuant to Government Code Section 56133(e). On July 8, 2014, the Authority and LHHCWD entered into an agreement that would allow the Authority to provide retail water service to properties located in LHHCWD's. jurisdiction, and to adjacent properties located in the jurisdiction and sphere of influence of the Rowland Water District. The properties are located in two non-contiguous service areas in both unincorporated Los Angeles County and the City of La Habra Heights. CDWC, a private mutual water company, currently delivers retail water services to the affected properties and, on December 16, 2013, entered into a Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") with the Authority to transfer all CDWC retail water facilities and services in the La Habra (Orange County)/La Habra Heights (Los Angeles County) areas to the Authority.

I appreciate the opportunity to review CDWC's request. While we have no formal comments on the proposed exemption affecting Los Angeles County properties, to ensure appropriate inter-county coordination of our LAFCOs, the following letter provides an overview of our understanding of CDWC's proposal to transfer retail water service to the Authority, and how we anticipate we will review and process a request for LAFCO approval of an out-of-agency service agreement between CDWC and the Authority for unincorporated properties in Orange County.

With respect to Los Angeles County, it is our understanding that the extraterritorial service extension by the Authority to the two non-contiguous service areas would occur under the July 8, 2014 agreement by and between the Authority and LHHCWD. Upon approval by LA LAFCO of an exemption under Government Code Section 56133(e), retail water service would be served to the two service areas by the Authority under that July 8, 2014 agreement, and in concert with the December 16, 2013 MOU between the Authority and CDWC. Such an exemption, however, is not applicable in Orange County and any proposed extraterritorial extension of retail water services by the Authority to CDWC customers located in unincorporated Orange County will require approval of an out-of-agency service agreement by Orange County LAFCO ("OC LAFCO").

OC LAFCO is currently participating in ongoing discussions with the City of La Habra ("City") about the proposed transfer of CDWC's retail water facilities and services to the Authority, and annexation of the six islands affected by that transfer to the City pursuant to Government Code Section 56375.3. We are currently assuming that the transfer of CDWC's water facilities/services in Orange County will occur initially through an out-of-agency service agreement and companion pre-annexation agreement. The six La Habra islands are neither jurisdictionally located in, nor currently served by, an existing public water agency. Therefore, an out-of-agency service agreement involving the islands in the City's sphere of influence requires the approval of OC LAFCO pursuant to subdivisions (a) and (b) of Government Code Section 56133, prior to the extension of services.

At this time, we have not identified any procedural conflicts or service-related issues for the areas located in Orange County as it relates to the exemption request submitted to LA LAFCO. The timing and outcome of OC LAFCO's review will occur independent of LA LAFCO's action on the exemption.

FACTORS TO BE CONSIDERED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE 56668:

a. Population:

The existing population is 82 residents as of January 31, 2013. The population density is 8.2 persons per acre.

The estimated future population is 82 residents (no anticipated change).

The affected territory is 10.00+/- acres. The existing land use is residential and vacant.

The assessed valuation is \$5,981,919 as of July 22, 2014. The per capita assessed valuation is \$72,950. On July 29, 2014, the County adopted a negotiated tax exchange resolution; all other involved public agencies have adopted a property tax transfer resolution.

The topography of the affected territory is generally flat with gently sloped terrain.

There are no natural boundaries. There is one existing drainage basin located within the affected territory.

The nearest populated area are immediately to the north, south, and west of the affected territory. The affected territory is likely to experience no growth in the next ten years. The adjacent areas are likely to experience no growth in the next ten years.

b. Governmental Services and Controls:

The affected territory includes 21 existing single-family homes and 1 existing drainage basin which require organized governmental services. The affected territory will require governmental services indefinitely.

The present cost and adequacy of government services and controls in the area are acceptable. The probable effect of the proposed action and of alternative courses of action on the cost and adequacy of services and controls in the affected territory and adjacent areas is for residents to pay lower rates than they would if they were to remain outside the District boundary and pay out-of-district rates.

c. Proposed Action and Alternative Actions:

The 21 existing single-family homes and 1 existing drainage basin will not impact the surrounding areas. There is no effect of the proposed action on mutual social and economic interest. As a special district annexation, the proposal has no impact on the local governmental structure of the County.

d. Conformity with Commission Policies on Urban Development and Open Space Conversion Policies:

There are no conformance issues because the Commission has not adopted any policies relative to providing planned, orderly, efficient patterns of urban development.

There is no prime agricultural land within or adjacent to the affected territory. The proposal conforms with the objectives in Government Code Sections 56377(a) and 56377(b).

e. Agricultural Lands:

There are no effects on agricultural lands, as defined. None of the land within the affected territory is currently used for the purpose of producing an agricultural commodity for commercial purposes. According to the California Department of Conservation, Division of Land Resource Protection, none of the land within the affected territory is subject to a Land Conservation Act (aka "Williamson Act") contract nor in a Farmland Security Zone (California Land Conservation Act 2012 Status Report).

f. Boundaries:

The boundaries of the affected territory have been clearly defined by the applicant, and these boundaries have been reviewed and approved by LAFCO's GIS/Mapping Technician.

The boundaries conform to lines of assessment or ownership, and these boundaries have been reviewed and approved by LAFCO's GIS/Mapping Technician.

As a special district annexation, the proposal has no impact on existing city-county boundaries, nor does it create islands or corridors of unincorporated territory.

g. Consistency with Plans:

The proposal has no significant impact upon, and is therefore consistent with, the Regional Transportation Plan.

The proposal is consistent with the existing City of Palmdale General Plan designation of SFR-2 (Single Family Residential).

The affected territory is not within the boundaries of any Specific Plan.

Pre-zoning is not a requirement for a special district proposal.

h. Sphere of Influence:

The affected territory is within the Sphere of Influence of the Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 40, Antelope Valley.

i. Comments from Public Agencies:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from public agencies or any resolutions raising objections from any affected agency.

j. Ability to Provide Services:

The affected territory is already being serviced by the Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 40, Antelope Valley.

k. Timely Availability of Water Supplies:

There are no known issues regarding water supply or delivery.

l. Regional Housing:

As a special district annexation, the proposal will not affect any city, nor the county, in achieving their respective fair shares of the regional housing needs as determined by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG).

m. Comments from Landowners, Voters, or Residents:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from landowners, voters, or residents.

n. Land Use Designations

The proposal is consistent with the existing City of Palmdale General Plan designation of SFR-2 (Single Family Residential).

The proposal is consistent with the existing City of Palmdale zoning designation of R-1-12,000 (single-family residential with a minimum lot size of 12,000 square feet).

o. Environmental Justice:

and conditions contained in Chapter 2 of Part 5, Division 3, Title 5 of the



Annual Election of Officers

Consistent with Section 10 of the Rules of the Commission Rules (adopted July 8, 2009), "the Commission shall be presided over by a Chair, a First Vice-Chair and a Second Vice-Chair, to be elected by the Commission."

Officer positions are currently held by Commissioner Jerry Gladbach (Chair) and Commissioner Donald Dear (First Vice-Chair). With the recent retirement of Commissioner Henri Pellissier, the Second Vice Chair position is currently vacant.

Consistent with Section 11 of the Commission Rules, the Commission "shall elect the Chair, First Vice-Chair and Second Vice-Chair at the first meeting of the Commission held in September of each year."

It would therefore be appropriate for the Commission to nominate and elect a member to serve as the Chair, First Vice-Chair, and Second Vice-Chair.

Recommended Action:

- 1. Nominate and elect a member to serve as LAFCO Chair for a term of one year and until the election of a successor;
- 2. Nominate and elect a member to serve as LAFCO First Vice-Chair for a term of one year and until the election of a successor; and
- 3. Nominate and elect a member to serve as LAFCO Second Vice-Chair for a term of one year and until the election of a successor.

Written Protests Valuation Policy

Pursuant to State law, LAFCO serves as the "conducting authority" for written protests involving changes of organization for cities and special districts within the Commission's purview.

The valuation or counting of written protests is governed by several provisions in the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000, including, but not limited to, the following, as summarized, in these sections of the Government Code:

- Section 57050 outlines the Commission's protest hearing and provides that a written protest may be withdrawn at any time prior to the conclusion of the protest hearing.
- Section 57051 states that written protests may be filed with the Executive Officer "[a]t any time prior to the conclusion of the protest hearing in the notice given by the executive officer, but not thereafter," and requires certain content in every written protest. It also authorizes specified agents for landowners and provides that signatures on protests without a date or bearing a date prior to the date of the published notice of the protest hearing shall be disregarded for the purposes of valuing the written protests. This section provides, further, that protests shall include the same information required for petitions as set out in Section 56704.
- Section 57052 provides that the Commission determines the value of written protests at the conclusion of the protest hearing in the same manner as set forth in specified sections for determining the sufficiency of petitions to the Commission.
- Section 57075 outlines the general procedures for valuing protests for inhabited territory and for uninhabited territory.
- Section 57075.5 outlines the special procedures for valuing protests for inhabited territory that is proposed to be annexed to a city with more than 100,000 residents¹ in Los Angeles County and any other county with a population of over 4,000,000.
- Section 56704 identifies specific information that must be provided if an individual is protesting as a registered voter or as a landowner.
- Section 56707 addresses the validation of signatures of registered voters by the Executive Officer.

- Section 56708 addresses the validation of signatures of landowners by the Executive Officer.
- Section 56710, for purposes of valuation of any protest signed by landowners, concerns
 the value of land exempt from taxation or owned by a public agency and land held in
 joint tenancy. This section further requires the Executive Officer to disregard certain
 signatures not shown as owners on the most recent assessment roll, unless certain written
 evidence is provided to the satisfaction of the Executive Officer.
- Section 56107 provides that the state law shall be liberally construed to effect its
 purposes, that no Commission determinations shall be invalidated due to any defect or
 omission which does not adversely and substantially affect the rights of any person or
 public agency as provided, and that Commission determinations shall be final and
 conclusive in the absence of fraud or prejudicial abuse of discretion.

These and other provisions of state law mandate the outcomes of protest hearings based upon the valuation of written protests received and not withdrawn during the protest period and prior to the conclusion of the protest hearing.

Once the Commission has made a finding as to the value of written, the outcome is a ministerial action—that is, the conclusion is determined by law, and it is not subject to any discretion by the Commission.

With respect to the valuation of written protests, there are a series of issues which state law does not address. These include, for example, whether protests can be submitted by fax or e-mail, as well as the precise cut-off time for protests deliver to LAFCO's office (as opposed to those submitted to the Commission at the protest hearing). In addition, and because the Commission meetings are held at the Los Angeles County Hall of Administration and LAFCO's Office is located in Pasadena, there are issues associated with receiving written protests that are unique to LA LAFCO. Because state law is silent on these issues, staff is recommending adoption of the attached policy to clarify these and other matters associated with the valuation of written protests.

Commission practice is that protest hearings are conducted by the Commission. Pursuant to a policy previously adopted by the Commission, the Commission may delegate the conduct of protest hearings to the Executive Officer.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Commission:

- 1. Adopt the enclosed draft Written Protests Valuation Policy; and
- 2. Direct the Executive Officer to post the Written Protests Valuation Policy on the Commission website.

Footnote:

According to the Bureau of the Census (2012) and the California Department of Finance (2010), cities in Los Angeles County with a population of more than 100,000 residents are Burbank, Downey, El Monte, Glendale, Inglewood, Lancaster, Long Beach, Los Angeles, Norwalk, Palmdale, Pasadena, Pomona, Santa Clarita, South Gate, Torrance, and West Covina. For the City of South Gate, the California Department of Finance estimates a population of 101,194; the Bureau of the Census 2012 estimates a population of 94,875.

DRAFT Written Protests Valuation Policy

(Proposed for Adoption on September 10, 2014)

1. Receipt of Written Protests:

Immediately upon receipt, LAFCO staff shall write the date and time on all written protests.

With respect to the counting of written protests, and provided that said written protest is received prior to the time certain that the Commission concludes the specified protest hearing, LAFCO will count all written protests which are received, and not withdrawn, via any of the following:

- U.S. mail received at LAFCO's office by 5:00 p.m. on the business day <u>preceding</u> the protest hearing date; or
- Courier delivery (FedEx, UPS, or similar delivery service) received at LAFCO's office by 5:00 p.m. on the business day <u>preceding</u> the protest hearing date; or
- Hand-delivered to LAFCO's office by the protesting party or his or her duly-authorized representative received at LAFCO's office by 5:00 p.m. on the business day <u>preceding</u> the protest hearing date; or
- Hand-delivered to the Commission and/or staff, at the noticed protest meeting of the Commission, by the protesting party or his or her duly-authorized representative, on the protest hearing date and prior to the closing of the protest hearing by the Commission Chair or Acting Chair.

LAFCO will not count written protests which are received:

- By facsimile ("fax") transmission; or
- By electronic mail ("e-mail"), including digital copies of an original signature; or
- Bearing a date prior to the date of publication of the protest hearing notice; or
- Delivered to the Commission and/or staff after the closing of the protest hearing by the Commission Chair or Acting Chair.

For purposes of valuing written protests only, any reference in this policy and in the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 to the close of the protest hearing will be construed to mean the close of the final protest hearing, meaning that any continuance of the protest hearing pursuant to Government Code Section 57050(a) will extend the time during which written protests will be accepted

2. Registered Voter Protest:

Data obtained from the Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder-County Clerk ("RRCC") shall determine the total number of registered voters within the boundaries of the affected territory at the time of the noticed protest hearing.

For purposes of calculating registered voter protests, LAFCO shall calculate the applicable percentage thresholds based upon the data obtained from the RRCC.

LAFCO will count written protests which include the following required information:

- Address of the property, providing street and number or other designation sufficient to enable the place of residence to be ascertained; and
- Original signature; and
- Original date of signature, which must be within the period starting with the publication of the protest hearing notice and ending at the time of the closing of the protest hearing by the Commission Chair or Acting Chair.

LAFCO will not count written protests under any of the following circumstances:

- The address of the property, or other designation sufficient to enable the place of residence to be ascertained, is not provided; or
- The original signature is not provided; or
- The original date of signature is not provided; or
- The original date of signature is prior to the date of publication of the protest hearing notice; or
- The original date of signature is after the date of the closing of the protest hearing by the Commission Chair or Acting Chair; or
- The written protest is from a registered voter who is not registered to vote within the boundaries of the affected territory; or

The written protest was not received consistent with the provisions in Section 1 ("Receipt of Written Protests"), above; or

- The individual who originally filed the protest withdraws his or her protest, in writing, within the time constraints identified herein; or
- Any protest which has been disqualified by the Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder-County Clerk (RRCC), in the event that the Executive Officer refers registered voter protests to the RRCC.

LAFCO staff will count all valid written protests from registered voters to determine the valuation and outcome. The Executive Officer may, at his or her discretion, refer any registered voter written protests to the RRCC for verification.

3. Landowner Protest:

Data obtained from the Los Angeles County Assessor's current tax rolls shall determine the total number of landowners within the boundaries of the affected territory.

For purposes of identifying all land-owners, and for calculating landowner protests, LAFCO shall calculate the applicable percentage thresholds based upon current tax rolls and the assessed value of land obtained from the Los Angeles County Assessor.

LAFCO will count written protests which include the following required information:

- Address of the property, providing street and number or other designation sufficient to enable the place of residence to be ascertained; and
- Original signature; and
- Original date of signature, which must be within the period starting with the publication of the protest hearing notice and ending at the time of the closing of the protest hearing by the Commission Chair or Acting Chair.

LAFCO will not count written protests under the following circumstances:

- The address of the property, or other designation sufficient to enable the place of residence to be ascertained, is not provided; or
- The original signature is not provided; or
- The original date of signature is not provided; or

- The original date of signature is prior to the date of publication of the protest hearing notice; or
- The original date of signature is after the date of the closing of the protest hearing by the Commission Chair or Acting Chair;
- The written protest was not received consistent with the provisions in Section 1 ("Receipt of Written Protests"), above;
- The individual signing the written protest is different than the owner of record provided by the Assessor based upon the most recent assessment roll, subject to the requirements of the exception identified in Government Code Section 56710(c); or
- The individual who originally filed the protest withdraws his or her protest, in writing, within the time constraints identified herein.

For those properties which are exempt from taxation owned by a public agency, the valuation shall be determined consistent with Government Code Section 56710(a).

For those properties held in joint tenancy or tenancy in common, the valuation shall be determined consistent with Government Code Section 56710(b).

4. All protests in writing

While oral testimony will be considered by the Commission, said testimony will not have any effect on the valuation of protests. Under state law, and this policy, it is only written protests, not later withdrawn in writing, if applicable, that count.

5. Outcomes:

Government Code Sections 57075 through 57077.4 describe whether the Commission considers written protests from registered voters, landowners, or both. Based on the valuation of the applicable protests, these sections dictate which of the following actions the Commission must take:

- Terminate the proceedings; or
- Order the change of organization or reorganization subject to an election; or

• Order the change of organization or reorganization without an election.

6. Results:

The Commission may announce results at the conclusion of the protest hearing, or, in the alternative, may postpone the announcement to a future meeting if LAFCO staff needs time to verify and value written protests.

CALAFCO is hosting its annual conference in Ontario from October 15 through October 17, 2014. Vacancies on CALAFCO's Board of Directors are voted on and approved at the Conference. There is a vacancy for a "city" representative from the Southern Region, and Commissioner David Spence has expressed an interest. CALAFCO requires that individual LAFCOs nominate candidates in advance of the conference.
