FACTORS TO BE CONSIDERED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE 56668:

a. Population:

The existing population is 0 residents as of October 16, 2015.

The population density issue does not apply because the affected territory is unpopulated.

The estimated future population is 0 residents (no anticipated change).

The affected territory is 4.744+/- acres. The existing land use consists of one existing warehouse.

The assessed valuation is \$168,729 as of October 16, 2015.

The per capita assessed valuation issue does not apply because the affected territory is unpopulated.

On December 8, 2015, the County adopted a negotiated tax exchange resolution; all other involved public agencies have adopted a property tax transfer resolution.

The topography of the affected territory is flat.

There are no natural boundaries.

There are no drainage basins on or near the affected territory.

The nearest populated area is 6,000 feet to the northwest of the affected territory. The affected territory is likely to experience modest growth in the next ten years. The adjacent areas are likely to experience modest growth in the next ten years.

b. Governmental Services and Controls:

The affected territory includes one existing warehouse which requires organized governmental services.

The present cost and adequacy of governmental services and controls in the area are acceptable. With respect to sanitary sewage disposal, other than service provided by the District, the only alternative is private septic systems. The cost of sewage disposal by the District versus the cost by septic system is subject to multiple factors and varies widely. Service by the District is considered to be more reliable than septic systems. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

c. Proposed Action and Alternative Actions:

The proposed action will have no effect on adjacent areas. The proposed action will have no effect on mutual social and economic interests. The proposal has no impact on the local governmental structure of the County.

The only alternate action for sewage disposal is a private septic system. Service by the District is considered to be more reliable than septic systems. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

d. Conformity with Commission Policies on Urban Development and Open Space Conversion Policies:

There are no conformance issues because the Commission has not adopted any policies relative to providing planned, orderly, efficient patterns of urban development.

There is no prime agricultural land within or adjacent to the affected territory. The proposal conforms with the objectives in Government Code Sections 56377(a) and 56377(b).

e. Agricultural Lands:

There are no effects on agricultural lands, as defined. None of the land within the affected territory is currently used for the purpose of producing an agricultural commodity for commercial purposes. n. Comments from Landowners, Voters, or Residents:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from landowners, voters, or residents.





With respect to sanitary sewage disposal, other than service provided by the District, the only alternative is private septic systems. The cost of sewage disposal by the District versus the cost by septic system is subject to multiple factors and varies widely. Service by the District is considered to be more reliable than septic systems. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

c. Proposed Action and Alternative Actions:

The proposed action will have no effect on adjacent areas. The proposed action will have no effect on mutual social and economic interests. The proposal has no impact on the local governmental structure of the County.

The only alternate action for sewage disposal is a private septic system. Service by the District is considered to be more reliable than septic systems. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

d. Conformity with Commission Policies on Urban Development and Open Space Conversion Policies:

There are no conformance issues because the Commission has not adopted any policies relative to providing planned, orderly, efficient patterns of urban development.

There is no prime agricultural land within or adjacent to the affected territory. The proposal conforms with the objectives in Government Code Sections 56377(a) and 56377(b).

e. Agricultural Lands:

There are no effects on agricultural lands, as defined. None of the land within the affected territory is currently used for the purpose of producing an agricultural commodity for commercial purposes. According to the California Department of Conservation, Division of Land Resource Protection, none of the land within the affected territory is subject to a Land Conservation Act (aka "Williamson Act") contract nor in a Farmland Security Zone (California Land Conservation Act 2012 Status Report).

f. Boundaries:

The boundaries of the affected territory have been clearly defined by the applicant, and these boundaries have been reviewed and approved by LAFCO's GIS/Mapping Technician.

The boundaries conform to lines of assessment or ownership, and these boundaries have been reviewed and approved by LAFCO's GIS/Mapping Technician.

As a special district annexation, the proposal has no impact on existing city-county boundaries, nor does it create islands or corridors of unincorporated territory.

g. Consistency with Regional Transportation Plan:

The proposal has no significant impact upon, and is therefore consistent with, the Regional Transportation Plan.

h. Consistency with Plans:

The proposal is consistent with the existing County's General Plan designation of Light Industrial (M-1).

The affected territory is not within the boundaries of any Specific Plan.

Pre-zoning is not a requirement for a special district proposal.

i. Sphere of Influence:

The affected territory is within the Sphere of Influence of the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County.

j. Comments from Public Agencies:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from public agencies or any resolutions raising objections from any affected agency.

k. Ability to Provide Services:

Although the affected territory is not currently serviced by the District, the area was included in the future service area that might be served by the District. The District's future wastewater management needs were addressed in the 2015 Santa Clarita Joint Sewerage System Facilities Plan and EIR.

I. Timely Availability of Water Supplies:

There are no known issues regarding water supply or delivery.

m. Regional Housing:

As a special district annexation, the proposal will not affect any city, nor the county, in achieving their respective fair shares of the regional housing needs as determined by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG).

n. Comments from Landowners, Voters, or Residents:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from landowners, voters, or residents.

o. Land Use Designations

The proposal is consistent with the existing County's General Plan designation of Light Industrial (M-1).

The proposal is consistent with the existing County's zoning designation of Light Industrial (M-1).

p. Environmental Justice:

All of the owners of real property within the affected territory have requested, in writing, that the District provide off-site sewage disposal service. Property-owners of adjacent areas did not request such service, and/or were contacted by Sanitation District staff and were not interested in securing such service or did not respond. The proposal promotes environmental justice, in that there is fair treatment of people of all races, cultures, and incomes with respect to the location of public facilities and the provision of public services.

There are no Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities (DUCs) within or adjacent to the affected territory.

CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) CLEARANCE:

The proposal is categorically exempt from the provisions of CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15319(b) because it is an annexation of small parcels of the minimum size for facilities exempted by Section 15303, New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures. In addition, there are no cumulative impacts, unusual circumstances, nor other limiting factors that would make the exemption inapplicable based on the proposal records.

<u>DETERMINATIONS WITHOUT NOTICE AND HEARING, AND WAIVER OF PROTEST PROCEEDINGS:</u>

Pursuant to Government Code Section 56662(a), the Commission may make determinations upon the proposed annexation without notice and hearing and may waive protest hearings for the reasons set forth herein. The territory is uninhabited. To date, no affected local agency has submitted a written demand for notice and hearing during the 10-day period referenced in Government Code Section 56662(c). Furthermore, the proposal was accompanied by satisfactory proof that all the landowners within the affected territory have given their written consent to the proposed annexation. Based thereon, the Commission may make determinations on the proposed annexation without notice and hearing, and the Commission may waive protest proceedings.

CONCLUSION:

Staff recommends approval of the proposal as a logical and reasonable extension of the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County which will be for the interest of landowners and/or present and/or future inhabitants within the district and within the annexation territory.

Recommended Action:

1. Adopt the Resolution Making Determinations, including the California Environmental Quality Act determinations, Approving and Ordering Annexation No. 1078 to Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County.

RESOLUTION NO. 2016-00RMD RESOLUTION OF THE LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION FOR THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES MAKING DETERMINATIONS APPROVING AND ORDERING "ANNEXATION NO. 1078 TO THE SANTA CLARITA VALLEY SANITATION DISTRICT OF LOS ANGELES COUNTY"

WHEREAS, the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District (District) adopted a resolution of application to initiate proceedings, which was submitted to the Local Agency Formation Commission for the County of Los Angeles (Commission), pursuant to, Division 3, Title 5, of the California Government Code (commencing with section 56000, the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000), for annexation of territory herein described to the District, all within the Los Angeles County unincorporated territory; and

WHEREAS, the proposed annexation consists of approximately 1.179± acres of uninhabited territory and is assigned the following distinctive short-form designation:

"Annexation No. 1078 to Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County"; and

WHEREAS, a description of the boundaries and map of the proposal are set forth in Exhibits "A" and "B", attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the principal reason for the proposed annexation is for the District to provide off-site sewage disposal for a proposed gas station; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Officer has reviewed the proposal and submitted to the Commission a written report, including his recommendations therein; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has determined that the Proposal meets all of the criteria for the Commission to make a determination without notice and hearing and waive protest proceedings entirely, pursuant to Government Code Section 56662; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Officer set the item for consideration for April 13, 2016 at 9:00 a.m., at the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors Hearing Room, Kenneth Hahn Hall of Administration Room 381-B, located at 500 West Temple Street, Los Angeles, California, 90012; and

WHEREAS, on April 13, 2016, this Commission considered the Proposal and the report of the Executive Officer.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- 1. The Commission, acting in its role as a responsible agency with respect to Annexation No. 1078 to the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County, finds that this annexation is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15319(b) because it is an annexation of small parcels of the minimum size for facilities exempted by Section 15303, New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures. In addition, there are no cumulative impacts, unusual circumstances, nor other limiting factors that would make the exemption inapplicable based on the proposal records.
- 2. Pursuant to Government Code Section 56662(a), the Commission hereby finds and determines that:
 - a. The territory encompassed by the annexation is uninhabited; and
 - b. Pursuant to Government Code Sections 56658(b)(1) and 56662(c), the Executive Officer has given the required mailed notice to each affected agency of the application to initiate proceedings for the proposed annexation, and no affected

local agency has submitted a written demand for notice and hearing during the 10-day period following the notice; and

c. The annexation was accompanied by satisfactory proof that all owners of land within the affected territory have given their written consent to the proposal.

Based thereon, pursuant to Government Code Section 56662 (a), the Commission may, and hereby does, make determinations on the proposal without notice and hearing, and the Commission may, and hereby does, waive protest proceedings entirely.

- 3. A description of the boundaries and map of the proposal, as approved by this Commission, are set forth in Exhibits "A" and "B", attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein.
- 4. The affected territory consists of 1.179± acres, is uninhabited, and is assigned the following short form designation:

"Annexation No. 1078 to Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County".

- Annexation No. 1078 to Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County is hereby approved, subject to the following terms and conditions:
 - a. The District agrees to defend, hold harmless and indemnify LAFCO and/or its agents, officers and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against LAFCO and/or its agents, officers and employees to attack, set aside, void or annul the approval of LAFCO concerning this proposal or any action relating to or arising out of such approval.

- b. The effective date of the annexation shall be the date of recordation.
- c. Payment of Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk and State Board of Equalization fees.
- d. The territory so annexed shall be subject to the payment of such service charges, assessments or taxes as may be legally imposed by the District.
- e. The regular County assessment roll shall be utilized by the District.
- f. The affected territory will be taxed for any existing general indebtedness, if any, of the District.
- g. Annexation of the affected territory described in Exhibits "A" and "B" to the District.
- h. Except to the extent in conflict with "a" through "g", above, the general terms and conditions contained in Chapter 2 of Part 5, Division 3, Title 5 of the California Government Code (commencing with Government Code Section 57325) shall apply to this annexation.
- The Commission herby orders the uninhabited territory described in Exhibits "A" and "B" annexed to the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County.
- 7. The Executive Officer is directed to transmit a copy of this resolution to the District, upon the District's payment of the applicable fees required by Government Code Section 54902.5 and prepare, execute and file a certificate of completion with the appropriate public agencies, pursuant to Government Code Section 57200, et seq.



Fiscal Year 2016-17 Proposed Budget

Background

Government Code Section 56381, requires the Commission to adopt proposed and final budgets and distribute them for review and comment to the County, and each city and independent special district in Los Angeles County. Upon approval of the proposed budget, a final budget will be noticed for public hearing and considered by the Commission on June 8, 2016.

State law requires that at a minimum, the proposed and final budget shall be equal to the budget adopted for the previous fiscal year.

Proposed Budget

The proposed budget for the 2016-17 fiscal year is \$1,406,430. This amount represents a 3% increase over FY 2015-16 year-end projections. As presented, the Proposed Budget anticipates receipt of \$83,100 in revenue from fees and interest earnings, and \$1,323,330 from local agency apportionments.

The overall impact on Funding agencies will be a 3% increase over the prior year's allocation. As in years past, this increase is necessary to address increasing healthcare costs, as well as the unfunded liability associated with other post-employment benefits (OPEB).

Revenue

<u>Fees</u>

It is anticipated that LAFCO will receive an estimated \$75,000 in fees from processing applications. The actual amount received from fees is not within LAFCO's control and depends entirely on the level of application activity.

Local Agency Apportionments

Total local agency apportionments will increase by \$34,835 (3%) over FY 2015-16 apportionments. The total amount billable to funding agencies is \$1,323,330. As stated above, this increase is primarily attributed with increased costs associated with healthcare and other post-employment benefits.

Fund Balance Carryover

Fund balance carryover funds fluctuates year-to-year, based on the difference between adopted fiscal year expenditures and revenues and actual end-year totals. Third quarter projections show a balance of less than \$40,000 remaining at year end. Further revisions may be necessary as we get a better indication of current year expenses towards the end of this fiscal year.

Budget Categories

Expenses: 50000 Series

50001/50014 - Salaries

The recommended budget for this account will sustain the current level of staffing of six full-time positions and one three-quarter time position. The account also takes into consideration an estimated 2% COLA for five of the seven positions, as authorized in the employment contracts (the COLA provision does not apply to employees hired after 2011). The actual COLA increase is not known at this time. However, it will be based on the reporting of the index for the L.A./Riverside/Orange area on June 30, 2016.

<u>50015 - Retirement</u>

Employer costs for retirement are based on rates recommended by an independent consulting actuary and adopted by the Board of Investments and the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors (BOS). The BOS approved a revised employer contribution rate on July 1, 2015, the net effect of this revision was a reduction in rates for both employer and employee. The employer rates in effect as of July 1, 2015, are as follows: 17.70% (down from 19.74%) for Plan D members, 18.97% (down from 20.95%) for Plan E members, and 17.66% (down from 19.53%) for Plan G members.

50016 - Accrued vacation/sick cash-out

In January and July of each year employees can elect to convert a maximum of three days sick and up to 50% of the allotted vacation accruals to pay (this provision does not apply to employees hired after 2011). For FY 2015-16 a total of 6 sick days and 19 vacation days were converted to pay.

<u>50017 - Stipends</u>

This amount account allocates funds to cover the attendance at the monthly LAFCO meetings, and participation at a LAFCO-related meeting, as authorized in the Rules of the Commission. FY 2016-17 budgeted amount is projected at \$25,000, \$2,000 less than the previous fiscal year.

50018 - Worker's Compensation

Final program costs for the 2015-16 program year is project at \$22,100. The 2016-17 annual contribution is forecast at \$22,400.

50019 - Group Health and Dental Insurance

This account allocates 100% subsidy for 7 employees and eligible family members enrolled in the County sponsored medical and dental plans (as required by existing employment contracts). For employees hired after 2011, only the employee is covered.

50022 - Other Postemployment Benefits (OPEB): Existing Retirees

LAFCO subsidizes 40% of the cost for postemployment health care for the two existing retirees. OPEB costs are paid on a pay-as-you go system. For the two retirees end of fiscal year costs are estimated at \$11,300. The estimated annual required contribution to fund OPEB-Existing Retirees during FY 2016-17 is \$15,700.

Office Expense – 50000A Series

<u>5</u>0025 - Rent

The current office lease provides for an automatic 3% increase each year. The next scheduled increase will take effect on December 1, 2016. Rent will increase from \$7,101 to \$7,314 per month, plus the proportionate share of operating costs.

50026 - Communications

This account is utilized for local and long distance telephone and internet services provided by Charter Communication; AT&T is the current cellular service provider.

<u>50027 - Supplies</u>

LAFCO utilizes a government contract with Office Depot to procure general office supplies. The proposed budget is unchanged from the current fiscal year.

50029 - Equipment Maintenance and Supplies

This account is utilized systems maintenance and supplies.

50030 - Equipment Rental/Lease

LAFCO leases a color copier from Ricoh Corp., at a monthly rate of \$1,567, plus per copy charges of \$0.01 for black and white and \$0.075 for color copies. This account is also utilized to cover lease payments for the postage metering system.

50031 - Employee/Other Parking Fees

This account is utilized to pay for employee parking, at a monthly rate of \$90 per space for 7 employees. The account is also utilized to purchase parking validations to subsidize parking costs for visitors conducting business at the LAFCO office.

50032 - Other Insurance

This account is for property liability, general liability, and public officials and employees errors and omissions insurance, purchased through Special District Risk Management Authority, a joint powers authority. MetLife insurance policies for the Executive Officer and Deputy Executive Officer are also funded through this account.

50033 - Agency Membership Dues

This account is for membership in professional associations - CALAFCO, the California Special District Association and the American Planning Association.

50040 - Information Technology/Programming

This accounts covers maintenance, repair and technical support provided by a contracted vendor.

50052 - Legal Notices

The account covers legal advertising costs. The budgeted amount is one-third less than the current fiscal year.

50053 - Publications

This account covers the yearly costs for publications utilized by staff and/or the Commission. A typical publication would be the yearly updates to Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Act and LAFCO-related pamphlets.

50054 - Postage

The account covers all US Postal Service, FedEx and UPS mailing and shipping costs.

50055 - Audio-Visual Service

The Los Angeles County Department of Internal Services provides audio setup at commission meetings, at a rate is \$226 per hour, with a minimum of two hours per meeting.

50056 - Printing Account

This account is for reproduction services by outside contractors, such as letterhead, business cards, etc.

50057 - Conferences/Travel, Commissioners

This account reimburses travel expenses and mileage for Commissioners attending LAFCO-related conferences; and for those members, acting in an official capacity, on the governing boards of the California Association of LAFCOs and/or the California Coalition of LAFCOs.

50058 - Conferences/Travel, Staff

This account covers costs incurred by staff for attendance at CALAFCO sponsored educational workshops and conferences; as well as travel to the CALAFCO Legislative Committee meetings. The Executive Officer serves on this Committee.

This account will also be used to reimburse staff for miles driven in the course of conducting LAFCO-related business (Executive Officer and Deputy Executive Officer are excluded).

50060 - Auto Reimbursement

The Executive Officer and Deputy Executive Officer positions are allocated \$6700 yearly for each position for auto reimbursement.

50061 - Various Vendors

LAFCO contracts with various local vendors to provide recurring specialized services.

50065 - Miscellaneous

This account is utilized for procurements and services not otherwise categorized within the budget.

50067 - Computer and Miscellaneous equipment

This account is utilized to upgrade equipment that has reached its useful life expectancy.

Professional Services - 50000C Series

50076 - Legal Services

This account is utilized for legal services provided by Los Angeles County Counsel's office. Billable costs also include registration fees and travel expenses for attendance at LAFCO-related workshops and conferences.

This account is also utilized for legal services provided by special counsel for either ligation or when a conflict of interest waiver is not granted.

50077 - Accounting & Bookkeeping

This account is designated for payment of payroll processing services by ADP; contracted bookkeeping and CPA services; and the annual audit.

50078 - Contract Services

This account covers specialized contracted services such as offsite records management, and archival file scanning services.

50081 - Municipal Service Reviews

This is an ongoing allocation established for projects that may require the services of an outside consultant.

Contingencies and Reserves

20020 - OPEB Liability Reserves

This account is used solely to fund the unfunded liability associated with Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB). As of July 1, 2013, the most recent actuarial valuation date, the accrued liability for benefits was estimated at \$711,231. In FY 2015-16 the budgeted allocation was increased from \$50,000 to \$100,000.

Revenue – 40000 Series

40001-40004 - Local Agency Apportionment

The net cost of the Commission's operating expenses will be apportioned to local agencies – Los Angeles County, City of Los Angeles, the other 87 cities, and independent special districts within the County. Net costs will be the equivalent of total appropriations less expected revenues.

40005 - Filing Fees

Fee revenue is generated from incoming project applications. The current projections put revenue from fees at \$75,000.

<u>40007 - Interest</u>

Interest from pooled investments is projected at \$7,400.

40012 - Fund Balance Carryover

While the Budget projects an estimated \$38,500 in carryover funds, we will not know definitely until the Final Budget is prepared.

40013 - Investment Pool Transfer In

End-of-year projections assume there will no remaining funds to partially offset the FY 2016-17 Budget.

Recommended action:

- 1. Open the budget hearing; after receiving public comments, close the budget hearing.
- 2. Approve the attached Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2016-17.
- 3. Pursuant to Government Code Section 56381, direct staff to forward the Proposed Budget to the County of Los Angeles, and the 88 cities and 54 independent special districts in Los Angeles County for their comments.
- 4. Set June 8, 2016 for hearing on adoption of the Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2016-17.

FACTORS TO BE CONSIDERED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE 56668:

a. Population:

The existing population is 0 residents as of June 9, 2015.

The population density issue does not apply because the affected territory is unpopulated.

The estimated future population is 1,525 residents.

The affected territory is 245.042+/- acres. The proposed/future land use consists of 96 proposed single-family homes, 413 proposed condominiums, one proposed community recreation facility, and one proposed junior high school.

The assessed valuation is \$7,096,441 as of June 9, 2015.

The per capita assessed valuation issue does not apply because the affected territory is unpopulated.

On December 8th 2015, the County adopted a negotiated tax exchange resolution; all other involved public agencies have adopted a property tax transfer resolution.

The topography of the affected territory is gentle to moderately steep slopes and a dry river bed.

The Santa Clara River is located 2,000 feet south of the affected territory. There are no drainage basins on or near the affected territory.

The affected territory is surrounded by residential and open space.

The affected territory is likely to experience significant growth in the next ten years. The adjacent areas are likely to experience no growth in the next ten years.

b. Governmental Services and Controls:

The affected territory will be developed to include 96 proposed single-family homes, 413 proposed condominiums, one proposed community recreation facility, and one proposed junior high school which require organized governmental services. The affected territory will require governmental services indefinitely.

The present cost and adequacy of governmental services and controls in the area are acceptable. With respect to sanitary sewage disposal, other than service provided by the District, the only alternative is private septic systems. The cost of sewage disposal by the District versus the cost by septic system is subject to multiple factors and varies widely. Service by the District is considered to be more reliable than septic systems. Service by the

District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

c. Proposed Action and Alternative Actions:

The proposed action will have no effect on mutual social and economic interests. The proposal has no impact on the local governmental structure of the County.

The only alternate action for sewage disposal is a private septic system. Service by the District is considered to be more reliable than septic systems. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

d. Conformity with Commission Policies on Urban Development and Open Space Conversion Policies:

There are no conformance issues because the Commission has not adopted any policies relative to providing planned, orderly, efficient patterns of urban development.

There is no prime agricultural land within or adjacent to the affected territory. The proposal conforms with the objectives in Government Code Sections 56377(a) and 56377(b).

e. Agricultural Lands:

There are no effects on agricultural lands, as defined. None of the land within the affected territory is currently used for the purpose of producing an agricultural commodity for commercial purposes. According to the California Department of Conservation, Division of Land Resource Protection, none of the land within the affected territory is subject to a Land Conservation Act (aka "Williamson Act") contract nor in a Farmland Security Zone (California Land Conservation Act 2012 Status Report).

f. Boundaries:

The boundaries of the affected territory have been clearly defined by the applicant, and these boundaries have been reviewed and approved by LAFCO's GIS/Mapping Technician.

The boundaries conform to lines of assessment or ownership, and these boundaries have been reviewed and approved by LAFCO's GIS/Mapping Technician.

As a special district annexation, the proposal has no impact on existing city-county boundaries, nor does it create islands or corridors of unincorporated territory.

g. Consistency with Regional Transportation Plan:

The proposal has no significant impact upon, and is therefore consistent with, the Regional Transportation Plan.

h. Consistency with Plans:

The proposal is consistent with the existing City's General Plan designation of Residential Suburban and Residential Medium.

The affected territory is not within the boundaries of any Specific Plan.

Pre-zoning is not a requirement for a special district proposal.

i. Sphere of Influence:

The affected territory is within the Sphere of Influence of the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County.

j. Comments from Public Agencies:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from public agencies or any resolutions raising objections from any affected agency.

k. Ability to Provide Services:

Although the affected territory is not currently serviced by the District, the area was included in the future service area that might be served by the District. The District's future wastewater management needs were addressed in the 2015 Santa Clarita Joint Sewerage System Facilities Plan and EIR.

l. Timely Availability of Water Supplies:

There are no known issues regarding water supply or delivery.

m. Regional Housing:

As a special district annexation, the proposal will not affect any city, nor the county, in achieving their respective fair shares of the regional housing needs as determined by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG).

n. Comments from Landowners, Voters, or Residents:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from landowners, voters, or residents.

o. Land Use Designations

The proposal is consistent with the existing City's General Plan designation of Residential Suburban and Residential Medium.

The proposal is consistent with the existing City's zoning designation of Residential Very Low Density (RVL).

p. Environmental Justice:

All of the owners of real property within the affected territory have requested, in writing, that the District provide off-site sewage disposal service. Property-owners of adjacent areas did not request such service, and/or were contacted by Sanitation District staff and were not

interested in securing such service or did not respond. The proposal promotes environmental justice, in that there is fair treatment of people of all races, cultures, and incomes with respect to the location of public facilities and the provision of public services.

There are no Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities (DUCs) within or adjacent to the affected territory.

CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) CLEARANCE:

The CEQA clearance is an Environmental Impact Report certified by the City of Santa Clarita, as lead agency, on April 25, 2006. The Commission is a responsible agency pursuant to CEQA and State CEQA Guidelines Section 15096.

CONCLUSION:

Staff recommends approval of the proposal as a logical and reasonable extension of the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County which will be for the interest of landowners and/or present and/or future inhabitants within the district and within the annexation territory.

Recommended Action:

- 1. Open the protest hearing and receive written protests;
- 2. Close the protest hearing;
- 3. Instruct the Executive Officer, pursuant to Government Code Section 57075, to determine the value of written protests filed and not withdrawn and report back to the Commission with the results; and
- 4. Based upon the results of the protest hearing, either adopt a resolution terminating the annexation proceedings if a majority protest exists pursuant to Government Code Section 57078, or ordering Annexation No. 1073 to Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County if written protests have been filed and not withdrawn by owners of land who own less than 50 percent of the total assessed value of land within the affected territory.

WHEREAS, the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District (District) adopted a resolution of application to initiate proceedings, which was submitted to the Local Agency Formation Commission for the County of Los Angeles (Commission), pursuant to, Division 3, Title 5, of the California Government Code (commencing with section 56000, the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000), for annexation of territory herein described to the District, all within the City of Santa Clarita; and

WHEREAS, the proposed annexation consists of approximately 245.042± acres of uninhabited territory and is assigned the following distinctive short-form designation:

"Annexation No. 1073 to Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County"; and

WHEREAS, a description of the boundaries and map of the proposal are set forth in Exhibits "A" and "B", attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the principal reason for the proposed annexation is for the District to provide off-site sewage disposal for 96 proposed single-family homes, 413 proposed condominiums, one proposed community recreation facility, and one proposed junior high school; and

WHEREAS, on February 10, 2016, the Commission approved Annexation No. 1073 to the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 57002, the Commission set the protest hearing for April 13, 2016 at 9:00 a.m., at the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors Hearing Room, Kenneth Hahn Hall of Administration Room 381-B, located at 500 West Temple Street, Los Angeles, California, 90012; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Officer has given notice of the protest hearing pursuant to Government Code Sections 56150-56160, 56660-56661, 57025, and 57026, wherein the protest hearing notice was published in a newspaper of general circulation in the County of Los Angeles on March 14, 2016, which is at least 21 days prior to the protest hearing, and said hearing notice was also mailed to all required recipients by first-class mail on or before the date of newspaper publication; and

WHEREAS, at the time and place fixed in the notice, the hearing was held, and any and all oral or written protests, objections, and evidence were received and considered; and

WHEREAS, the Commission, acting as the conducting authority, has the ministerial duty of tabulating the value of protests filed and not withdrawn and either terminating these proceeding if a majority protest exists or ordering the annexation directly; and the Commission has received a report and recommendations on adoption of a conforming resolution from its Executive Officer.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

1. The Commission finds that the number of property owners is 2, and the total assessed value of land within the affected territory is \$7,096,441.

- 2. The Commission finds that the number of written protests filed in opposition to Annexation No. 1073 to Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County and not withdrawn is ____, which, even if valid, represents owners of land who own less than 50 percent of the assessed value of land within the affected territory.
- 3. A description of the boundaries and map of the proposal, as approved by this Commission, are set forth in Exhibits "A" and "B", attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein.
- 4. The affected territory consists of 245.042± acres, is uninhabited, and is assigned the following short form designation:
 - "Annexation No. 1073 to Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County"
- 5. Annexation No. 1073 to Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County is hereby approved, subject to the following terms and conditions:
 - a. The District agrees to defend, hold harmless and indemnify LAFCO and/or its agents, officers and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against LAFCO and/or its agents, officers and employees to attack, set aside, void or annul the approval of LAFCO concerning this proposal or any action relating to or arising out of such approval.
 - b. The effective date of the annexation shall be the date of recordation.
 - c. Payment of Registrar- Recorder/County Clerk and State Board of Equalization fees.

- d. The territory so annexed shall be subject to the payment of such service charges, assessments or taxes as may be legally imposed by the District.
- e. The regular County assessment roll shall be utilized by the District.
- f. The affected territory will be taxed for any existing general indebtedness, if any, of the District.
- g. Annexation of the affected territory described in Exhibits "A" and "B" to the District.
- h. Except to the extent in conflict with "a" through "g", above, the general terms and conditions contained in Chapter 2 of Part 5, Division 3, Title 5 of the California Government Code (commencing with Government Code Section 57325) shall apply to this annexation.
- The Commission herby orders the uninhabited territory described in Exhibits "A" and "B" annexed to Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County.
- 7. 

FACTORS TO BE CONSIDERED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE 56668:

a. Population:

The existing population is 231 residents as of January 31, 2013. The population density is 1.49 persons per acre.

The estimated future population is 231 residents (no anticipated change).

The affected territory is 154.68+/- acres. The existing land use is residential and vacant land.

The assessed valuation is \$36,643,091 as of December 1, 2015. The per capita assessed valuation is \$158,628. On November 3, 2015, the County adopted a negotiated tax exchange resolution; all other involved public agencies have adopted a property tax transfer resolution.

The topography of the affected territory is generally flat with sloped terrain to the north.

There are no natural boundaries. There are various drainage channels located within the affected territory.

The affected territory is surrounded by residential and vacant land. The affected territory is likely to experience no growth in the next ten years. The adjacent areas are likely to experience modest growth in the next ten years.



MAKING DETERMINATIONS ORDERING "REORGANIZATION NO. 2015-08 TO THE GREATER LOS ANGELES COUNTY VECTOR CONTROL DISTRICT (AMENDMENTS TO THE GREATER LOS ANGELES COUNTY VECTOR CONTROL DISTRICT AND THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY WEST VERCTOR CONTROL DISTRICT SPHERES OF INFLUENCE (SOIS); DETACHMENT FROM THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY WEST VECTOR CONTROL DISTRICT; AND ANNEXATION TO THE GREATER LOS ANGELES COUNTY VECTOR CONTROL DISTRICT)

FOR A PORTION OF THE CITY OF GARDENA"

WHEREAS, the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District (District) adopted a resolution of application to initiate proceedings, which was submitted to the Local Agency Formation Commission for the County of Los Angeles (Commission), pursuant to, Division 3, Title 5, of the California Government Code (commencing with section 56000, the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000), for annexation of territory herein described to the District, and detachment of said territory from the Los Angeles County West Vector Control District, all with a portion of the City of Gardena; and

WHEREAS, the proposed annexation consists of approximately 200.17± acres of inhabited territory and is assigned the following distinctive short-form designation:

"Reorganization No. 2015-08 to the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District"; and WHEREAS, a description of the boundaries and map of the proposal are set forth in Exhibits "A" and "B", attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the principal reason for the proposed reorganization is for the District to provide mosquito and vector control services to the affected territory, as the District already provides those services to the rest of the City of Gardena (City). In order to provide consistent and continuous services to the residents and businesses within the City, both agencies agree

that a reorganization is appropriate; and

WHEREAS, on February 10, 2016, the Commission approved Reorganization No. 2015-08 to the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 57002, the Commission set the protest hearing for April 13, 2016 at 9:00 a.m., at the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors Hearing Room, Kenneth Hahn Hall of Administration Room 381-B, located at 500 West Temple Street, Los Angeles, California, 90012; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Officer has given notice of the protest hearing pursuant to Government Code Sections 56150-56160, 56660-56661, 57025, and 57026, wherein the protest hearing notice was published in a newspaper of general circulation in the County of Los Angeles on March 16, 2016, which is at least 21 days prior to the protest hearing, and said hearing notice was also mailed to all required recipients by first-class mail on or before the date of newspaper publication; and

WHEREAS, at the time and place fixed in the notice, the hearing was held, and any and all oral or written protests, objections, and evidence were received and considered; and

WHEREAS, the Commission, acting as the conducting authority, has the ministerial duty of tabulating the value of protests filed and not withdrawn and either terminating these proceedings if a majority protest exists or ordering the annexation directly or subject to confirmation by the registered voters.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- The Commission finds that the number of property owners is 913, and the number of registered voters is 1,087, and the total assessed value of land within the affected territory is \$145,604,431.
 - a) The Commission finds that the number of property owners who filed written protests in opposition to Reorganization No. 2015-08 to the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District, and not withdrawn is _____, which, even if valid, represents less than 25 percent of the number of owners of land who own at least 25 percent of the assessed value of land within the affected territory; and
 - b) The Commission finds that the number of registered voters who filed written protests in opposition to Reorganization No. 2015-08 to the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District, and not withdrawn is _____, which, even if valid, represents less than 25 percent of the number of registered voters residing within boundaries of the affected territory.
- 3. A description of the boundaries and map of the proposal, as approved by this Commission, are set forth in Exhibits "A" and "B", attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein.
- 4. The affected territory consists of 200.17± acres, is inhabited, and is assigned the following short form designation:

"Reorganization No. 2015-08 to the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District"

- 5. Reorganization No. 2015-08 to the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District is hereby approved, subject to the following terms and conditions:
 - a. The District agrees to defend, hold harmless and indemnify LAFCO and/or its agents, officers and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against LAFCO and/or its agents, officers and employees to attack, set aside, void or annul the approval of LAFCO concerning this proposal or any action relating to or arising out of such approval.
 - b. The effective date of the reorganization shall be the date of recordation.
 - c. Payment of Registrar- Recorder/County Clerk and State Board of Equalization fees.
 - d. The territory so annexed shall be subject to the payment of such service charges, assessments or taxes as may be legally imposed by the District.
 - e. The regular County assessment roll shall be utilized by the District.
 - f. The affected territory will be taxed for any existing general indebtedness, if any, of the District.
 - g. Reorganization of the affected territory described in Exhibits "A" and "B" to the District.
 - h. Except to the extent in conflict with "a" through "g", above, the general terms and conditions contained in Chapter 2 of Part 5, Division 3, Title 5 of the California Government Code (commencing with Government Code Section 57325) shall apply to this annexation.

6. The Commission herby orders the inhabited territory described in Exhibits "A" and "B"

annexed to District.

7. The Executive Officer is directed to transmit a copy of this resolution to the District, upon

the District's payment of the applicable fees required by Government Code Section

54902.5 and prepare, execute and file a certificate of completion with the appropriate

public agencies, pursuant to Government Code Section 57200, et seq.



Legislative Update Request for Commission Support of AB 2910

Staff is requesting that the Commission take a position in support of AB 2910.

On March 15th, the Assembly Local Government Committee (ALGC) introduced AB 2910. This bill, also known as the annual Omnibus Bill, is sponsored by CALAFCO. The contents of the bill are a result of suggestions from individual LAFCOs about technical changes and clarifications to the language in the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (the Act). These suggestions are then reviewed by the CALAFCO Legislative Committee, and ultimately forwarded on to ALGC staff. On occasion, and at the request of other parties, other changes to the Act will be included in the Omnibus Bill.

AB 2910 proposes the following revisions to the Act:

- Government Code Section 56134: Proposes revisions in a provision relating only to new or extended services provided pursuant to a fire protection contract to change the phrase "service area" to "jurisdictional boundaries," and to change "comprehensive fiscal analysis" to "fiscal analysis." These changes were suggested by the California Professional Firefighters (CPF), the sponsors of the 2015 bill (SB 239) which added Section 56134 to the Act. The changes make the intent of Section 56134 clearer.
- Government Code Section 56150: Proposed changes further enable LAFCO distribution of required public hearing notices by e-mail or hand delivery to satisfy notice mailing requirements (proposed by John Benoit, contract executive officer to several Northern California LAFCOs).
- Government Code Section 56301: Clarifies that LAFCO's mission is "ensuring the
 efficient provision of government services" rather than "efficiently providing"
 government services. The change reflects the fact that LAFCOs do not directly provide
 government services (proposed by Kai Luoma, Executive Officer of Ventura LAFCO).
- Government Code Section 56331: Proposed change would require the Public Member and Alternate Public Member to be a resident of the county in which the LAFCO is located (proposed by Lou Ann Texeira, Executive Officer of Contra Costa LAFCO).
- Government Code Section 56700.4: Would eliminate a notice requirement to the petitioner when the petitioner files the proposal with LAFCO and is the sole owner of all property within the affected territory (proposed by George Spiliotis, Executive Officer of Riverside LAFCO).

- Government Code Section 56816: Corrects a typographical error by adding the word "to" mid-sentence in a section dealing only with city disincorporations (proposed by Andrea Ozdy, Analyst at Ventura LAFCO).
- Government Code Section 56881: Corrects a typographical error by changing "change or organization" to "change of organization" in a section dealing with the contents of resolutions of determination [emphasis added] (proposed by Mona Palacios, Executive Officer of Alameda LAFCO).

A copy of AB 2910 is attached to this staff report.

The CALAFCO Legislative Committee has considered, and supports, all proposed changes identified herein

CALAFCO has requested that all LAFCOs take a position in support of AB 2910, and convey that support in writing to the Legislature and Governor. Staff recommends that the Commission take a position in support of AB 2910.

Recommended Action:

1. Direct staff to draft a letter in support of AB 2910, authorize the Chair to sign the letter, and direct staff to forward the letter to the Legislature and Governor, on behalf of the Commission.
