### Sativa Water System Status Report

# **Background:**

Pursuant to Condition 9.x. of Dissolution No. 2018-09 of the Sativa County Water District, the County of Los Angeles (County) has continued to provide the Commission with quarterly written reports regarding the status of County operations of the Sativa Water System.

# **Status:**

The County's most recent report (December 19, 2019) is attached. Significant highlights of the report are:

- 1. Sativa's water meets all Primary Drinking Water Standards and is safe to drink. Brown water complaints have dropped to zero, and Sativa customers report clear, clean water flowing from their taps."
- 2. The County is pursuing a series of grant funding to improve the state of Sativa's infrastructure, which include repair of a damaged segment of pipeline, rehabilitation of both of Sativa's existing wells with installation of a manganese treatment system, replacement or improvement of Sativa's chlorination system, and installation of technology at Sativa's wells to permit remote monitoring and control.
- 3. Construction to replace the damaged pipeline segment will begin in January 2020 and is scheduled to be completed in March 2020. Repair work to Well 5 is ongoing and should be completed by spring 2020, at which time Well 3 will be taken off-line for repair and maintenance, which is anticipated to be completed by the fall of 2020. If grant funds are secured, construction of the manganese treatment system is expected to begin in the fall of 2020 to be completed by the following year.
- 4. The State Water Board provided the County \$1.77 million in grant funds to address several of the infrastructure repairs and upgrades. The County has partnered with the Water Replenishment District (WRD) to apply for \$2.25 million in Proposition 1 funding through the State Department of Water Resources' Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) Program.
- 5. The RFP for the transfer of the Sativa Water System was issued on September 11, 2019. Five proposal were received:

- California American Water
- Central Basin MWD [Municipal Water District]
- Liberty Utilities
- Golden State Water
- Suburban Water Systems
- 6. The evaluation committee, composed of four drinking water experts and LAFCO Commissioner Margaret Finlay, conducted oral interviews on December 12, 2019, and a recommended bidder is being identified. The County will notify LAFCO of its recommendation when the review process is completed, which includes community outreach.
- 7. The schedule for the remaining elements of the RFP process is as follows:

Identification of a Recommended Bidder: December 2019
 Community Meeting with Sativa Community: December 2019
 Finalize Recommendation: January 2020
 Board of Supervisors Approval: February 2020

• Transfer to Permanent Water Service Provider: Spring 2020 to Mid-2021.

8. If an investor owned utility is selected as Sativa's permanent service provider, that entity will be required to submit an application to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) requesting approval to take over operation of Sativa. The CPUC approval process could last up to 18 months.

A representative of the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works is expected to attend today's meeting, and he or she will be available should Commissioners have questions or concerns.

# **Staff Recommendation:**

Staff recommends that the Commission:

1. Receive and file the Sativa County Water District Status Report.

# Proposed Memorandum of Understanding with Ventura LAFCO

# Agenda Item 9.b.

### February 12, 2020

Staff is proposing that the Commission enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Ventura LAFCO (copy enclosed) to designate the "principal county" for Sphere of Influence (SOI) amendments for special districts to the LAFCO in the County where the affected territory is located, in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Government Code. Los Angeles LAFCO has previously approved similar MOU agreements with the Orange and San Bernardino LAFCOs.

Under current law, it is the LAFCO for the so-called "principal county" of a special district which processes all requests to amend a Sphere of Influence or annex territory. Section 56066 defines "principal county" as the county which has "all or the greater portion of the entire assessed value . . . of all taxable property within a district." Previously thought to apply only to annexations, a 2006 court case (the "Truckee Decision") determined that the "principal county" provision of State law applies to SOI determinations as well as annexations.

Under existing law, the LAFCO for a "principal county" could expand the SOI and territory of a special district into Los Angeles County, without any knowledge by Los Angeles County or LA LAFCO. Staff is concerned about this possibility and is supportive of an approach where the responsibility for such applications is shared between the two involved LAFCOs.

To address this issue, and on two prior occasions, the Commission has approved a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to exchange principal county status with San Bernardino LAFCO (on October 12, 2011) and with Orange LAFCO (November 9, 2011). For applications where the affected territory is not located within the principal county, the MOU "transfers" the authority to process the SOI amendment to the LAFCO in which the affected territory is located. The "principal county" LAFCO retains the authority to process any annexation requests.

Underlying this MOU approach is a sense that the LAFCO for the county in which the territory is located (the non "principal county" LAFCO) will have a better and more complete understanding of the local service delivery philosophies, land use goals and policies, and what other overlaying special districts within the area are, and is therefore best suited to address any potential duplication of service and other service delivery concerns.

The proposed MOU mirrors the existing language in the existing MOUs with Orange LAFCO and San Bernardino LAFCO; further, the language has been approved as to form by legal

counsel to both LA LAFCO and Ventura LAFCO. Ventura LAFCO's Executive Officer of Ventura is agendizing the MOU for consideration by Ventura LAFCO on February 19, 2020.

# **Recommended Action:**

- 1. Authorize the Chair to sign the proposed Memorandum of Understanding with Ventura LAFCO; and
- 2. Upon execution by a Ventura LAFCO representative, direct staff to post a copy of the MOU to the website.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR EXCHANGE OF PRINCIPAL COUNTY STATUS FOR SPHERE OF INFLUENCE CHANGES LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION FOR VENTURA COUNTY AND

# THE LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION FOR THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) IS MADE THIS 12<sup>TH</sup> DAY OF FEBRUARY, 2020 BY AND BETWEEN THE LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION FOR VENTURA COUNTY (hereinafter Ventura LAFCO) and the LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION FOR THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES (hereinafter LA LAFCO).

# **RECITALS**

The following recitals are a substantive part of this MOU:

- 1. In January 2006 in the Third Appellate District of the Court of Appeal for the State of California a decision was rendered, identified commonly as the "Truckee Decision", which applied the California Government Code Section 56066 definition of "principal county" to determinations for spheres of influence under the provision of Government Code Section 56425 et seq.
- 2. Principal county is defined in the California Government Code at § 56066 which reads as follows: "Principal county" means the county having the greater portion of the entire assessed value, as shown on the last equalized assessment roll, of the county or counties, of all taxable property within a district or districts for which a change organization or reorganization is proposed.
- 3. Government Code §§ 56123 and 56124 allow for the transfer of exclusive jurisdiction from the principal county LAFCO to the affected county LAFCO if all of the following occur:
  - a. The commission of the principal county approves of having exclusive jurisdiction vested in another affected county;
  - b. The commission of the principal county designates the affected county to assume exclusive jurisdiction; and,
  - c. The commission of the affected county so designated agrees to assume exclusive jurisdiction.

- 4. The LA LAFCO and VLAFCO have numerous entities which abut, and in certain instances cross over county boundary lines. Both LA LAFCO and VLAFCO agree that the LAFCO of the county within which the affected territory is situated should be the LAFCO that determines the sphere of influence, due to their knowledge of underlying service providers, affected agencies within and surrounding the entity within the affected county, and understanding the development standards and vision within the affected county. This memorandum of understanding is intended to set forth these understandings in a formal manner and to identify that as allowed by Government Code Section 56375(q) the LAFCOs have agreed to transfer authority for processing of sphere of influence applications.
- 5. This MOU between Ventura LAFCO and LA LAFCO is to establish the terms and conditions for the vesting of exclusive jurisdiction in the matters of sphere of influence determinations to the Commission of the affected county from the Commission of the principal county.

# NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE COVENANTS, CONDITIONS AND PROMISES CONTAINED HEREIN, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

# 1. Sphere of influence Transfer Determinations:

- a. When a proposal is contemplated to extend a special district's sphere of influence into the adjacent county, or expand or reduce a sphere of influence that is already located in the adjacent county, the LA LAFCO or VLAFCO acting as principal county does hereby approve the transfer of exclusive jurisdiction for those determinations to the affected county;
- b. The transfers shall be to the affected county within which the affected territory considered for sphere of influence extension, expansion or reduction lies; and,
- c. Acting as the affected County, the LA LAFCO or VLAFCO agrees to assume the exclusive jurisdiction for sphere of influence determinations within its respective county territory.

#### 2. Term of MOU

The term of this MOU shall commence upon execution of this agreement by both LAFCOs and shall remain in effect until specific action is taken to terminate it in its entirely or to modify the MOU. This MOU constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and is executed without reliance upon any representations or promises not contained herein.

# 3. Responsibilities for complying with transfer of exclusive jurisdiction:

Each LAFCO shall advise applicant(s) seeking the extension of a sphere of influence into the adjacent county, or the expansion or reduction of a sphere of influence already located in the adjacent county of a special district for which it is designated "principal county" that the applicant(s) shall submit said request to the affected county LAFCO. The application requirements, including fees and processing costs, of the LAFCO vested and exclusive jurisdiction shall apply. The LAFCO with exclusive jurisdiction shall include the principal county LAFCO in all notices, provision of staff reports, and resolutions related to the sphere of influence consideration process. Nothing in this MOU shall be construed to limit in any way the provision of State Law governing the consideration process for a sphere of influence change.

### 4. Compliance with Government Code Section 56430

The policies and procedures of the LAFCO vested with exclusive jurisdiction by this MOU shall apply to the processing of any sphere of influence change with regards to Government Code Section 56430. Nothing in this section would preclude the LAFCO vested with exclusive jurisdiction from using the service review data and/or determinations prepared by the principal LAFCO for the affected local agency.

## **5.** Modification

This MOU constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any previous agreements, oral or written. This MOU may be modified only by subsequent mutual written agreement executed by Ventura LAFCO and LA LAFCO and will not be effective until signed by all parties.

#### **6.** Termination

This MOU may be terminated by either party by giving a 60-day notice in writing following action of the terminating Commission.

# 7. California Law

This MOU shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Any action commenced about this Agreement shall be filed in the Superior Court of the affected County. The MOU shall be construed as though jointly drafted by the Parties with the assistance of independent legal counsel.

# **8.** Indemnification

LALAFCO or VLAFCO or LA LAFCO each agree to indemnify, defend at their own expense, including attorney's fees, and hold each other harmless from and against all claims, costs, penalties, causes of action, demands, losses and liability of any nature,

whatsoever, including but not limited to liability for bodily injury, sickness, disease or death, property damage (including loss of use) or violation of law, caused by or arising out of or related to any negligent act or willful misconduct of the party, its officers or employees or any other agent acting pursuant to its control and performing under this agreement.

# Proposed Exercise of Option with Davis Farr LLP to Prepare Fiscal Year 2019-20 Audit

Agenda Item No. 9.c.

#### February 12, 2020

In August of 2016, the Commission awarded a contract to a certified public accounting firm (Davis Farr, LLP) to prepare audits for four fiscal years, beginning with Fiscal Year 2015-16 through Fiscal Year 2019-20. Davis Farr's auditors have completed their audits for four fiscal years (2015-16 through 2018-19); at your January Meeting, the Commission received and filed the FY 2018-19 audit. The contract allows LAFCO the option of continuing to use Davis Farr to prepare an audit for the current fiscal year, FY 2019-20.

Staff believes that Davis Farr has performed well in preparing the last four audits. Davis Farr representatives work well with LAFCO staff as well as our contract accountant and bookkeeper. Additionally, the Executive Officers of the other four LAFCOs which utilize Davis Farr (Imperial, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino LAFCOs) conveyed to staff that they plan to recommend that their Commissions exercise their respective option years with Davis Farr.

Staff requests that the Commission authorize the Executive Officer to exercise the option to extend the contract for a year with Davis Farr and authorize the firm to prepare the audit for FY 2019-20.

#### Recommendation

It is recommended that the Commission:

1. Authorize the Executive Officer to exercise the option for a one-year contract extension with Davis Farr to prepare the audit for FY 2019-20.

# Proposed Joint Request for Proposal with Southern Region LAFCOs for Auditing Services

#### Agenda Item No. 9.d.

### February 12, 2020

LAFCO's 2016 contract with a certified public accounting firm (Davis Farr, LLP) to prepare audits is nearing its conclusion. Contingent upon the Commission action relative to Agenda Item 9.c., the final year would involve Davis Farr's audit for LAFCO's 2019-20 Fiscal Year.

On two previous occasions (June, 2012 and August, 2016), LAFCO has worked with four other LAFCOs (Imperial, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino LAFCOs) to issue a joint Request for Proposal (RFP) for auditing services. Staff has conferred with the executive officers of these four LAFCOs, all of whom are supportive of issuing a joint RFP later this year for auditing services for the next five years (Fiscal Years 2020-21 through FY 2024-25).

In the prior two auditing RFPs, representatives of all five LAFCOs have worked cooperatively and efficiently to solicit proposals, evaluate the submitted proposals, and reach consensus on a recommended auditor. More importantly, staff believes that issuing a joint RFP from five LAFCOs achieves substantial cost savings when compared to soliciting audit proposals exclusively for LA LAFCO. Further, any recommendation to award an auditing contract would be agendized for Commission approval at a future meeting.

Staff requests that the Commission authorize the Executive Officer to work with his counterparts at Imperial, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino LAFCOs to issue a Joint RFP for auditing services for Fiscal Years 2020-21 through FY 2024-25.

#### Recommendation

It is recommended that the Commission:

- 1. Authorize the Executive Officer to work with his counterparts at Imperial, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino LAFCOs to issue a Joint RFP for auditing services for Fiscal Years 2020-21 through FY 2024-25; and
- 2. Upon conclusion of the RFP solicitation and evaluation process, to return to the Commission with a recommendation to award a contract to the selected auditing firm.

# Legislative Update

Several bills from 2019 (the first year of the two-year Legislative Session) have carried over into 2020:

• <u>AB 1253 (Rivas, Robert):</u> The "CALAFCO funding bill" did not make it through the Assembly Appropriations Committee and it became a two-year bill.

# Commission Position: SUPPORT (3/13/2019 Meeting)

• AB 818 (Cooley): This bill would restore the Vehicle License Fee ("VLF") increase for the first five years of a newly-incorporated city. It did not make it through the Assembly Local Government Committee, and it became a two-year bill. The bill was considered by the Assembly Appropriations Committee on January 23, 2020, and it was held under submission.

# **Commission Position: SUPPORT (3/13/2019 Meeting)**

• <u>AB 213 (Reves)</u>: This bill would reinstate the Vehicle License Fee ("VLF") for city annexations of inhabited territory. It did not make it through the Senate Appropriations Committee, and it became a two-year bill.

#### Commission Position: SUPPORT (3/13/2019 Meeting)

- AB 1389 (Eggman): This bill would require that a special district mitigate any loss of property taxes, franchise fees, and other revenues to any other affected local agency in the course of a proposed annexation. The bill did not make it through the Assembly Local Government Committee, and it became a two-year bill.
- AB 1751 (Chiu): This bill would authorize the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) to require the dissolution of a water or sewer system that has fewer than 3,300 service connections and serves a disadvantaged community. The bill would require application to LAFCO to approve or deny the application. SB 1751 did not make it through the Assembly Appropriations Committee and it became a two-year bill.
- <u>SB 414 (Caballero)</u>: This bill, sponsored by the Eastern Municipal Water District and the California Municipal Utilities Association, would allow the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) to require the dissolution of water systems (public, mutual, and private). Due to concerns from CALAFCO and several LAFCOs, the bill was amended to require the SWRCB to apply to LAFCO to consider the proposed dissolution. The bill did not make it through the Assembly Appropriations Committee, and it became a two-year bill.

There is also one additional bill introduced in early January, 2020:

• AB 315 (Garcia): Introduced on January 6, 2020, this bill would prohibit the use of dues paid by a public agency to trade association (including CALAFCO) to direct educational activities or lobbying efforts. CALAFCO has joined a coalition of stakeholders to oppose the bill ahead of January 15<sup>th</sup> hearing date, which was cancelled by the author. While the bill is officially dead, Assemblywoman Garcia has indicated that she will introduce similar legislation before the February 21, 2020 deadline.
