Agenda Item No. 6.d. Legislative Update

The Legislature reconvened on January 3, 2025.

Staff has identified the following bills which may impact LAFCOs:

- AB 259 (Rubio): Assemblywoman Blanca Rubio's AB 259 would remove the sunset on AB 2449 (Rubio, 2449), which amended the Brown Act to authorize additional procedures for LAFCO commissioners to participate remotely in meetings. AB 259 is pending before the Assembly Local Government Committee. (see additional information in Agenda Item 10.a.). The bill is with the Senate Local Government Committee, awaiting the scheduling of a committee meeting.
- **SB 598 (Durazo):** Introduced on February 20, 2025, Senator Maria Elena Durazo's SB 598 would make one non-substantive change to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (Government Code §56000 *et seq*). Staff understands that this bill will likely be amended in a manner wherein LAFCOs will not be impacted. The bill is with the Rules Committee, awaiting assignment to a committee.
- **SB 634 (Perez):** Introduced on February 20, 2025, the intent of Senator Sasha Perez' SB 634 is to "enact legislation relating to local government." The Legislative Counsel's digest for the bill references the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (Government Code §56000 *et seq*). Staff understands that this bill will likely be amended in a manner wherein LAFCOs will not be impacted. The bill is with the Rules Committee, awaiting assignment to a committee.
- **SB 740 (Rubio):** Existing law requires a municipal water agency to notify LAFCO in writing, within thirty (30) days, if it enters into an agreement or amends an existing agreement to provide stormwater management services. Senator Susan Rubio's SB 740 would extend the deadline to forty (40) days. The bill is with the Rules Committee, awaiting assignment to a committee.

GOVERNMENT CODE § 56857 NOTICE (For Information Purposes Only, Receive and File)

Upon receipt of any proposed change of organization or reorganization that includes the annexation of territory to any district, if the proposal is not filed by the district to which annexation of territory is proposed, Government Code Section 56857(a) requires the Executive Officer to place the proposal on its agenda for information purposes only, and to transmit a copy of the proposal to any district to which annexation is requested. Pursuant to Government Code Section 56857(b), no more than 60 days after the meeting agenda date, the district to which annexation is being proposed may adopt and submit to the Local Agency Formation Commission ("LAFCO") a resolution requesting termination of the proceedings. The law requires that any such resolution requesting termination must be based upon written findings supported by substantial evidence in the record that the request is justified by a financial or service-related concern, or the territory is already receiving electrical services under a service area agreement approved by the Public Utilities Commission. Prior to LAFCO's termination of proceedings, the resolution is subject to judicial review as provided in Government Code Sections 56857(b) and (c).

LAFCO may not hear and consider the proposal until after the 60-day termination period has expired unless the district to which an annexation of territory is requested adopts and submits to LAFCO a resolution supporting the proposal.

allowed by the current zoning.

Additional Information: None.

CERTIFICATE OF FILING

Pursuant to Government Code § 56020.6, a Certificate of Filing (COF) is "the document issued by the executive officer that confirms an application for a change of organization or reorganization has met submission requirements and is accepted for filing."

Upon reviewing the proposal for completeness, and pursuant to the requirements of Government Code § 56658, the Executive Officer issued the COF to the applicant on February 25, 2025. In conjunction with the issuance of the COF, the Executive Officer set the date of consideration for this proposal as Wednesday, March 12, 2025.

FACTORS TO BE CONSIDERED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE § 56668:

a. Affected population, territory and adjacent areas:

The existing population is zero (0) residents as of April 27, 2023.

The population density issue does not apply because the affected territory is unpopulated.

The estimated future population is 0 residents (no anticipated change).

The affected territory is 0.46+/- acres. The affected territory is undeveloped. The territory consists of a vacant sliver of land.

The assessed valuation is \$194,467 as of April 27, 2023.

The per capita assessed valuation issue does not apply because the affected territory is unpopulated.

On December 3, 2024, the County adopted a negotiated tax exchange resolution; all other involved public agencies have adopted a corresponding property tax transfer resolution.

The topography of the affected territory is slope.

There are no drainage basins on or near the affected territory.

The nearest populated area is 2,000 feet to the north of the affected territory.

The affected territory is likely to experience modest growth in the next ten years. The adjacent areas are likely to experience no growth in the next ten years.

b. Governmental Services and Controls:

The affected territory consists of a vacant sliver of land which may require organized governmental services.

The present cost and adequacy of governmental services and controls in the area are acceptable. With respect to sanitary sewage disposal, other than service provided by the District, there is no other sewer service alternative. The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health prohibits the installation, alteration, or repair of any on-site wastewater treatment systems for any building for which connection to a public sewer system is available within 200 feet. Due to the proposed land uses within the annexation area and its proximity to existing sewer infrastructure, public sewer service is the only viable alternative for development to occur. The cost of sewage disposal by the District is relatively preferable since the annexation is relatively close to an existing public sewer system. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

c. Proposed Action and Alternative Actions:

The proposed action will have no effect on adjacent areas. The proposed action will have no effect on mutual social and economic interests. The proposal has no impact on the local government structure of the County. There is no alternative to public sewage disposal. Service by the District is considered more reliable than septic systems. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

d. Conformity with Commission Policies on Urban Development and Open Space, and Conformity with Open Space Land Conversion Policies in Government Code § 56377:

The proposal does not conflict with any Commission-adopted policies on urban development and open space conversion.

There is no prime agricultural land within or adjacent to the affected territory. The proposal conforms with the objectives in Government Code § 56377.

e. Agricultural Lands:

There are no effects on agricultural lands, as defined by Government Code § 56016. None of the land within the affected territory is currently used for the purpose of producing an agricultural commodity for commercial purposes, land left fallow under a crop rotation program, or land enrolled in an agricultural subsidy or set-aside program. According to the California Department of Conservation, Division of Land Resource Protection, none of the land within the affected territory is subject to a Land Conservation Act (aka "Williamson Act") contract nor in a Farmland Security Zone (California Land Conservation Act 2020-2021 Status Report).

f. Boundaries:

The boundaries of the affected territory have been clearly defined by the applicant, conform to lines of assessment or ownership, and have been reviewed and approved by LAFCO's GIS/Mapping Technician.

The Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County is a sanitation district. The proposed annexation to Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County is therefore subject to the provisions of its principal act, which is the County Sanitation District Act of 1923, Health and Safety Code § 4700 et seq. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code § 4830:

"Territory, whether situated within the same or another county and whether incorporated or unincorporated, which is:

- (a) not included in any other county sanitation district, or other district formed for similar purposes, OR
- (b) which is included in any district, which district is not, at the time of the proposed annexation, performing similar services in the area proposed to be annexed,

may be annexed to a county sanitation district if the directors find and determine that the additional territory will be benefited by annexation."

The land proposed to be annexed need not consist of contiguous parcels nor be contiguous with the county sanitation district when such land is within the same county.

When land proposed to be annexed is not within the same county such land shall be contiguous to the district."

The affected territory in this proposed annexation is located in Los Angeles County, which is the same county in which the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County is located, and the proposal therefore complies with Health and Safety Code § 4830.

The affected territory in this proposed annexation is contiguous to the existing boundaries of the District, is not within the boundaries of a County Sanitation District, or is within the boundaries of a district not performing similar services, and the sanitation district board of directors find and determine that the additional territory will be benefited by annexation, therefore complying with the contiguity provisions of the County Sanitation District Act of 1923 (Health and Safety Code § 4830).

As a special district annexation, the proposal has no impact on existing city-county boundaries, nor does it create islands or corridors of unincorporated territory.

g. Regional Transportation Plan:

The Southern California Associated Governments (SCAG) adopted its 2020-2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS) pursuant to Government Code § 65080. The closest highway to the annexation is part of the RTP and SCS's State Highway improved program. The closest highway in the RTP/SCS is the

Antelope Valley Freeway (State Route 14), which is approximately 5,000 feet east of the affected territory.

h. Consistency with Plans:

The proposal is consistent with the existing City's General Plan designation of Specific Plan (Needham Ranch).

The proposal is consistent with the existing City's Specific Plan.

Pre-zoning is not a requirement for a special district proposal.

i. Sphere of Influence:

The affected territory is within the Sphere of Influence of the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County.

j. Comments from Public Agencies:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from public agencies or any resolutions raising objections from any affected agency.

k. Ability to Provide Services:

Although the affected territory is not currently served by the District, the area was included in the future service area that might be served by the District in its Sewer Facilities Plan. The District's future wastewater management needs were addressed in the 2015 Santa Clarita Joint Sewerage System Facilities Plan and EIR.

l. Timely Availability of Water Supplies:

There are no known issues regarding water supply or delivery. The affected territory is within the boundaries of the Santa Clarita Valley Water Agency, which is the local water purveyor.

m. Regional Housing Needs:

As a special district annexation, the proposal will not affect any city, nor the county, in achieving their respective fair shares of the regional housing needs as determined by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG).

n. Comments from Landowners, Voters, or Residents:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from landowners, voters, or residents.

o. Land Use Designations

The proposal is consistent with the existing City's General Plan designation of Specific Plan (Needham Ranch).

The proposal is consistent with the existing City's zoning designation of Specific Plan (Needham Ranch).

p. Environmental Justice:

The owners of real property within the affected territory have requested, in writing, that the District provide off-site sewage disposal service. Property-owners of adjacent areas did not request such service, and/or were contacted by Sanitation District staff and were not interested in securing such service or did not respond. The proposal makes no representations on exclusions of peoples of any race, culture, income and/or national origins with respect to the location of public facilities and public services, to ensure a healthy environment for all people such that the effects of the pollution are not disproportionately borne by any particular populations or communities.

There are no Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities (DUCs) within or adjacent to the affected territory according to data obtained and extracted from the Census Bureau of the United States Department of Commerce 2016-2020 American Community Survey (ACS).

q. Hazard Mitigation Plan:

The City of Santa Clarita Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (approved September 2021) establishes the City's emergency policies and procedures in the event of a disaster and addresses allocation of resources and protection of the public in the event of an emergency.

The Safety Element of the General Plan for the City of Santa Clarita (adopted May 2022) addresses reduction of the potential risk of death, injuries, and economic damages resulting from natural and man-made hazards.

The affected territory is not within a Very High Fire Hazard Zone pursuant to maps published by the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (Cal Fire). The affected territory is not within the maps that identify State Responsibility Area. Both the City of Santa Clarita Hazard Mitigation Plan and the Safety Element of the General Plan include information relating to mitigation and management of wildfire and fire hazard severity zones.

ADDITIONAL FACTORS TO BE CONSIDERED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE § 56668.3:

a) District Annexation or City Detachment:

The proposed action involves a district annexation.



CERTIFICATE OF FILING

Pursuant to Government Code § 56020.6, a Certificate of Filing (COF) is "the document issued by the executive officer that confirms an application for a change of organization or reorganization has met submission requirements and is accepted for filing."

Upon reviewing the proposal for completeness, and pursuant to the requirements of Government Code § 56658, the Executive Officer issued the COF to the applicant on February 25, 2025. In conjunction with the issuance of the COF, the Executive Officer set the date of consideration for this proposal as Wednesday, March 12, 2025.

FACTORS TO BE CONSIDERED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE § 56668:

a. Affected population, territory and adjacent areas:

The population density issue does not apply because the affected territory is unpopulated.

The estimated future population is two hundred forty-eight (248) residents.

The affected territory is 30.91+/- acres. The affected territory is vacant. The territory consists of ninety-nine (99) proposed single-family homes.

The assessed valuation is \$775,000 as of September 18, 2023.

The per capita assessed valuation issue does not apply because the affected territory is unpopulated.

On December 3, 2024, the County adopted a negotiated tax exchange resolution; all other involved public agencies have adopted a corresponding property tax transfer resolution.

The topography of the affected territory is flat.

There are no natural boundaries within or adjacent to the affected territory.

There are no drainage basins on or near the affected territory.

The affected territory is surrounded by populated areas to the east, south and west and vacant to the north.

The affected territory is likely to experience significant growth in the next ten years. The adjacent areas are likely to experience some growth in the next ten years.

b. Governmental Services and Controls:

The affected territory will be developed to include ninety-nine (99) proposed single-family homes which require organized governmental services. The affected territory will require governmental services indefinitely.

The present cost and adequacy of governmental services and controls in the area are acceptable. With respect to sanitary sewage disposal, other than service provided by the District, there is no other sewer service alternative. The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health prohibits the installation, alteration, or repair of any on-site wastewater treatment systems for any building for which connection to a public sewer system is available within 200 feet. Due to the proposed land uses within the annexation area and its proximity to existing sewer infrastructure, public sewer service is the only viable alternative for development to occur. The cost of sewage disposal by the District is relatively preferable since the annexation is relatively close to an existing public sewer system. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

c. Proposed Action and Alternative Actions:

The proposed action will have no effect on adjacent areas. The proposed action will have no effect on mutual social and economic interests. The proposal has no impact on the local government structure of the County. There is no alternative to public sewage disposal. Service by the District is considered more reliable than septic systems. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

d. Conformity with Commission Policies on Urban Development and Open Space, and Conformity with Open Space Land Conversion Policies in Government Code § 56377:

The proposal does not conflict with any Commission-adopted policies on urban development and open space land conversion.

There is no prime agricultural land within or adjacent to the affected territory. The proposal conforms with the objectives in Government Code § 56377.

e. Agricultural Lands:

There are no effects on agricultural lands, as defined by Government Code § 56016. None of the land within the affected territory is currently used for the purpose of producing an agricultural commodity for commercial purposes, land left fallow under a crop rotation program, or land enrolled in an agricultural subsidy or set-aside program. According to the California Department of Conservation, Division of Land Resource Protection, none of the land within the affected territory is subject to a Land Conservation Act (aka "Williamson Act") contract nor in a Farmland Security Zone (California Land Conservation Act 2020-2021 Status Report).

f. Boundaries:

The boundaries of the affected territory have been clearly defined by the applicant, conform to lines of assessment or ownership, and have been reviewed and approved by LAFCO's GIS/Mapping Technician.

The County Sanitation District No. 20 of Los Angeles County is a sanitation district. The proposed annexation to County Sanitation District No. 20 of Los Angeles County is therefore subject to the provisions of its principal act, which is the County Sanitation District Act of 1923, Health and Safety Code § 4700 et seq. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code § 4830:

"Territory, whether situated within the same or another county and whether incorporated or unincorporated, which is:

- (a) not included in any other county sanitation district, or other district formed for similar purposes, OR
- (b) which is included in any district, which district is not, at the time of the proposed annexation, performing similar services in the area proposed to be annexed,

may be annexed to a county sanitation district if the directors find and determine that the additional territory will be benefited by annexation."

The land proposed to be annexed need not consist of contiguous parcels nor be contiguous with the county sanitation district when such land is within the same county.

When land proposed to be annexed is not within the same county such land shall be contiguous to the district."

The affected territory in this proposed annexation is located in Los Angeles County, which is the same county in which the County Sanitation District No. 20 of Los Angeles County is located, and the proposal therefore complies with Health and Safety Code § 4830.

The affected territory in this proposed annexation is contiguous to the existing boundaries of the District, is not within the boundaries of a County Sanitation District, or is within the boundaries of a district not performing similar services, and the sanitation district board of directors find and determine that the additional territory will be benefited by annexation, therefore complying with the contiguity provisions of the County Sanitation District Act of 1923 (Health and Safety Code § 4830).

As a special district annexation, the proposal has no impact on existing city-county boundaries, nor does it create islands or corridors of unincorporated territory.

g. Regional Transportation Plan:

The Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) adopted its 2020-2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS) pursuant to Government Code § 65080. The closest highway to the annexation is part of the RTP and SCS's State Highway improved program. The closest highway in the RTP/SCS is the Interstate 10 Freeway (I-10), which is approximately 700 feet north from the affected territory.

h. Consistency with Plans:

The proposal is consistent with the existing City's General Plan designation of Single Family Residential (SFR-3).

The affected territory is not within the boundaries of any Specific Plan.

Pre-zoning is not a requirement for a special district proposal.

i. Sphere of Influence:

The affected territory is within the Sphere of Influence of the County Sanitation District No. 20 of Los Angeles County.

j. Comments from Public Agencies:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from public agencies or any resolutions raising objections from any affected local agency.

k. Ability to Provide Services:

Although the affected territory is not currently served by the District, the area was included in the future service area that might be served by the District in its Sewer Facilities Plan. The District's future wastewater management needs were addressed in the Palmdale Water Reclamation Plant 2025 Facilities Plan.

l. Timely Availability of Water Supplies:

There are no known issues regarding water supply or delivery. The affected territory is within the boundaries of Palmdale Water District which is the local water purveyor.

m. Regional Housing Needs:

As a special district annexation, the proposal will not affect any city, nor the county, in achieving their respective fair shares of the regional housing needs as determined by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG).

n. Comments from Landowners, Voters, or Residents:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from landowners, voters, or residents.

o. Land Use Designations

The proposal is consistent with the existing City's General Plan designation of Single Family (SFR-3).

The proposal is consistent with the existing City's zoning designation of Single Family Residential (R-1-7,000).

p. Environmental Justice:

The owners of real property within the affected territory have requested, in writing, that the District provide off-site sewage disposal service. Property-owners of adjacent areas did not request such service, and/or were contacted by Sanitation District staff and were not interested in securing such service or did not respond. The proposal makes no representations on exclusions of peoples of any race, culture, income and/or national origins with respect to the location of public facilities and public services, to ensure a healthy environment for all people such that the effects of the pollution are not disproportionately borne by any particular populations or communities.

There are no Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities (DUCs) within the affected territory, there are Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities (DUCs) adjacent to the affected territory, according to data obtained and extracted from the Census Bureau of the United States Department of Commerce 2016-2020 American Community Survey (ACS).

q. Hazard Mitigation Plan:

The City of Palmdale Hazard Mitigation Plan (revised September 30, 2016) establishes the City's emergency policies and procedures in the event of a disaster and addresses allocation of resources and protection of the public in the event of an emergency.

The Safety Element of the General Plan for the City of Palmdale (updated July 2015) addresses reduction of the potential risk of death, injuries, and economic damages resulting from natural and man-made hazards.

The affected territory is not within a Very High Fire Hazard Zone pursuant to maps published by the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (Cal Fire). - 6. The Commission hereby orders the uninhabited territory described in Exhibits "A" and "B" annexed to the County Sanitation District No. 20 of Los Angeles County.
- 7. The Executive Officer is hereby authorized and directed to mail copies of this resolution as provided in Government Code § 56882.
- 8. The Executive Officer is directed to transmit a copy of this resolution to the District, upon the District's payment of the applicable fees required by Government Code § 54902.5 and prepare, execute and file a certificate of completion with the appropriate public agencies, pursuant to Government Code § 57200, et seq.

The Commission is a responsible agency pursuant to CEOA and State CEOA Guidelines with respect to the proposed annexation, and in its independent judgment on the record determines that the proposal is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines § 15319(a) because the annexation consists of areas containing existing structures developed to the density allowed by the current zoning and the extension of services to the existing facilities would have the capacity to serve only the existing facilities, and State CEQA Guidelines § 15319(b) because it is an annexation of small parcels of the minimum size for facilities exempted by State CEQA Guidelines Section § 15303, New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures. A Categorical Exemption was adopted by the County Sanitation District No. 22 of Los Angeles County, as lead agency, on March 27, 2024.

CERTIFICATE OF FILING

Pursuant to Government Code § 56020.6, a Certificate of Filing (COF) is "the document issued by the executive officer that confirms an application for a change of organization or reorganization has met submission requirements and is accepted for filing."

Upon reviewing the proposal for completeness, and pursuant to the requirements of Government Code § 56658, the Executive Officer issued the COF to the applicant on February 25, 2025. In conjunction with the issuance of the COF, the Executive Officer set the date of consideration for this proposal as Wednesday, March 12, 2025.

FACTORS TO BE CONSIDERED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE § 56668:

a. Affected population, territory and adjacent areas:

The existing population is eight (8) residents as of November 9, 2023. The population density is 6.35 persons per acre.

The estimated future population is eight (8) residents (no anticipated change).

The affected territory is 1.26+/- acres. The affected territory is residential. The territory consists of one (1) existing single-family home, and two (2) proposed duplex structures.

The assessed valuation is \$1,326,376 as of November 9, 2023.

The per capita assessed valuation is 165,797.00.

On December 3, 2024, the County adopted a negotiated tax exchange resolution; all other involved public agencies have adopted a corresponding property tax transfer resolution.

The topography of the affected territory is flat.

There are no natural boundaries within or adjacent to the affected territory.

There are no drainage basins on or near the affected territory.

The affected territory is surrounded by populated areas on all sides.

The affected territory is likely to experience modest growth in the next ten years. The adjacent areas are likely to experience no growth in the next ten years.

b. Governmental Services and Controls:

The affected territory includes one (1) existing single-family home, and two (2) proposed duplex structures which requires organized governmental services indefinitely.

The present cost and adequacy of governmental services and controls in the area are acceptable. With respect to sanitary sewage disposal, other than service provided by the District, there is no other sewer service alternative. The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health prohibits the installation, alteration, or repair of any on-site wastewater treatment systems for any building for which connection to a public sewer system is available within 200 feet. Due to the proposed land uses within the annexation area and its proximity to existing sewer infrastructure, public sewer service is the only viable alternative for development to occur. The cost of sewage disposal by the District is relatively preferable since the annexation is relatively close to an existing public sewer system. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

c. Proposed Action and Alternative Actions:

The proposed action will have no effect on adjacent areas. The proposed action will have no effect on mutual social and economic interests. The proposal has no impact on the local government structure of the County. There is no alternative to public sewage disposal. Service by the District is considered more reliable than septic systems. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

d. Conformity with Commission Policies on Urban Development and Open Space, and Conformity with Open Space Land Conversion Policies in Government Code § 56377:

The proposal does not conflict with any Commission-adopted policies on urban development and open space land conversion.

There is no prime agricultural land within or adjacent to the affected territory. The proposal conforms with the objectives in Government Code § 56377.

e. Agricultural Lands:

There are no effects on agricultural lands, as defined by Government Code § 56016. None of the land within the affected territory is currently used for the purpose of producing an agricultural commodity for commercial purposes, land left fallow under a crop rotation program, or land enrolled in an agricultural subsidy or set-aside program. According to the California Department of Conservation, Division of Land Resource Protection, none of the land within the affected territory is subject to a Land Conservation Act (aka "Williamson Act") contract nor in a Farmland Security Zone (California Land Conservation Act 2020-2021 Status Report).

f. Boundaries:

The boundaries of the affected territory have been clearly defined by the applicant, conform to lines of assessment or ownership, and have been reviewed and approved by LAFCO's GIS/Mapping Technician.

The County Sanitation District No. 22 of Los Angeles County is a sanitation district. The proposed annexation to County Sanitation District No. 22 of Los Angeles County is therefore subject to the provisions of its principal act, which is the County Sanitation District Act of 1923, Health and Safety Code § 4700 et seq. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code § 4830:

"Territory, whether situated within the same or another county and whether incorporated or unincorporated, which is:

- (a) not included in any other county sanitation district, or other district formed for similar purposes, OR
- (b) which is included in any district, which district is not, at the time of the proposed annexation, performing similar services in the area proposed to be annexed,

may be annexed to a county sanitation district if the directors find and determine that the additional territory will be benefited by annexation."

The land proposed to be annexed need not consist of contiguous parcels nor be contiguous with the county sanitation district when such land is within the same county.

When land proposed to be annexed is not within the same county such land shall be contiguous to the district."

The affected territory in this proposed annexation is located in Los Angeles County, which is the same county in which the County Sanitation District No. 22 of Los Angeles County is located, and the proposal therefore complies with Health and Safety Code § 4830.

The affected territory in this proposed annexation is contiguous to the existing boundaries of the District, is not within the boundaries of a County Sanitation District, or is within the boundaries of a district not performing similar services, and the sanitation district board of directors find and determine that the additional territory will be benefited by annexation, therefore complying with the contiguity provisions of the County Sanitation District Act of 1923 (Health and Safety Code § 4830).

As a special district annexation, the proposal has no impact on existing city-county boundaries, nor does it create islands or corridors of unincorporated territory.

g. Regional Transportation Plan:

The Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) adopted its 2020-2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS) pursuant to Government Code § 65080. The closest highway to the annexation is part of the RTP and SCS's State Highway improved program. The closest highway in the RTP/SCS is the Interstate 10 Freeway (I-10), which is approximately 1,500 feet north from the affected territory.

h. Consistency with Plans:

The proposal is consistent with the existing County's General Plan designation of H2 - Residential 2.

The affected territory is not within the boundaries of any Specific Plan.

Pre-zoning is not a requirement for a special district proposal.

i. Sphere of Influence:

The affected territory is within the Sphere of Influence of the County Sanitation District No. 22 of Los Angeles County.

j. Comments from Public Agencies:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from public agencies or any resolutions raising objections from any affected local agency.

k. Ability to Provide Services:

Although the affected territory is not currently served by the District, the area was included in the future service area that might be served by the District in its Sewer Facilities Plan. The District's future wastewater management needs were addressed in the Joint Outfall System 2010 Master Facilities Plan.

l. Timely Availability of Water Supplies:

There are no known issues regarding water supply or delivery. The affected territory is within the boundaries of Three Valleys Municipal Water District which is the local water purveyor.

m. Regional Housing Needs:

As a special district annexation, the proposal will not affect any city, nor the county, in achieving their respective fair shares of the regional housing needs as determined by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG).

n. Comments from Landowners, Voters, or Residents:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from landowners, voters, or residents.

o. Land Use Designations

The proposal is consistent with the existing County's General Plan designation of H2 - Residential 2.

The proposal is consistent with the existing County's zoning designation of R1 (R-1-40000).

p. Environmental Justice:

The owners of real property within the affected territory have requested, in writing, that the District provide off-site sewage disposal service. Property-owners of adjacent areas did not

request such service, and/or were contacted by Sanitation District staff and were not interested in securing such service or did not respond. The proposal makes no representations on exclusions of peoples of any race, culture, income and/or national origins with respect to the location of public facilities and public services, to ensure a healthy environment for all people such that the effects of the pollution are not disproportionately borne by any particular populations or communities.

There are no Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities (DUCs) within or adjacent to the affected territory according to data obtained and extracted from the Census Bureau of the United States Department of Commerce 2016-2020 American Community Survey (ACS).

q. Hazard Mitigation Plan:

The County of Los Angeles All-Hazard Mitigation Plan (approved May 18, 2020) establishes the County's emergency policies and procedures in the event of a disaster and addresses allocation of resources and protection of the public in the event of an emergency.

The Safety Element of the General Plan for the County of Los Angeles (adopted July 12, 2022) addresses reduction of the potential risk of death, injuries, and economic damages resulting from natural and man-made hazards.

The affected territory is not within a Very High Fire Hazard Zone pursuant to maps published by the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (Cal Fire). The affected territory is within the maps that identify State Responsibility Area. Both the County's All-Hazard Mitigation Plan and the Safety Element of the General Plan include information relating to mitigation and management of wildfire and fire hazard severity zones.

CERTIFICATE OF FILING

Pursuant to Government Code § 56020.6, a Certificate of Filing (COF) is "the document issued by the executive officer that confirms an application for a change of organization or reorganization has met submission requirements and is accepted for filing."

Upon reviewing the proposal for completeness, and pursuant to the requirements of Government Code § 56658, the Executive Officer issued the COF to the applicant on February 27, 2025. In conjunction with the issuance of the COF, the Executive Officer set the date of consideration for this proposal as Wednesday, March 12, 2025.

FACTORS TO BE CONSIDERED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE § 56668:

a. Affected population, territory and adjacent areas:

The existing population is zero (0) residents as of October 18, 2023.

The population density issue does not apply because the affected territory is unpopulated.

The estimated future population is 0 residents (no anticipated change).

The affected territory is 4.17+/- acres. The territory consists of one (1) existing park within open space areas.

The assessed valuation is \$4,656 as of October 18, 2023.

The per capita assessed valuation issue does not apply because the affected territory is unpopulated.

On December 3, 2024, the County adopted a negotiated tax exchange resolution; all other involved public agencies have adopted a corresponding property tax transfer resolution.

The topography of the affected territory is slope and flat.

There are no drainage basins on or near the affected territory.

The nearest populated area is 1,500 feet to the north of the affected territory.

The affected territory is likely to experience no growth in the next ten years. The adjacent areas are likely to experience no growth in the next ten years.

b. Governmental Services and Controls:

The affected territory includes one (1) existing park within open space areas which may require organized governmental services.

The present cost and adequacy of governmental services and controls in the area are acceptable. With respect to sanitary sewage disposal, other than service provided by the District, there is no other sewer service alternative. The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health prohibits the installation, alteration, or repair of any on-site wastewater treatment systems for any building for which connection to a public sewer system is available within 200 feet. Due to the proposed land uses within the annexation area and its proximity to existing sewer infrastructure, public sewer service is the only viable alternative for development to occur. The cost of sewage disposal by the District is relatively preferable since the annexation is relatively close to an existing public sewer system. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

c. Proposed Action and Alternative Actions:

The proposed action will have no effect on adjacent areas. The proposed action will have no effect on mutual social and economic interests. The proposal has no impact on the local government structure of the County. There is no alternative to public sewage disposal. Service by the District is considered more reliable than septic systems. Service by the District is environmentally superior in terms of wastewater treatment, effluent discharge, and impacts on surface water bodies and groundwater.

d. Conformity with Commission Policies on Urban Development and Open Space, and Conformity with Open Space Land Conversion Policies in Government Code § 56377:

The proposal does not conflict with any Commission-adopted policies on urban development and open space conversion.

There is no prime agricultural land within or adjacent to the affected territory. The proposal conforms with the objectives in Government Code § 56377.

e. Agricultural Lands:

There are no effects on agricultural lands, as defined by Government Code § 56016. None of the land within the affected territory is currently used for the purpose of producing an agricultural commodity for commercial purposes, land left fallow under a crop rotation program, or land enrolled in an agricultural subsidy or set-aside program. According to the California Department of Conservation, Division of Land Resource Protection, none of the land within the affected territory is subject to a Land Conservation Act (aka "Williamson Act") contract nor in a Farmland Security Zone (California Land Conservation Act 2020-2021 Status Report).

f. Boundaries:

The boundaries of the affected territory have been clearly defined by the applicant, conform to lines of assessment or ownership, and have been reviewed and approved by LAFCO's GIS/Mapping Technician.

The Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County is a sanitation district. The proposed annexation to Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County is therefore subject to the provisions of its principal act, which is the County Sanitation District Act of 1923, Health and Safety Code § 4700 et seq. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code § 4830:

"Territory, whether situated within the same or another county and whether incorporated or unincorporated, which is:

- (a) not included in any other county sanitation district, or other district formed for similar purposes, OR
- (b) which is included in any district, which district is not, at the time of the proposed annexation, performing similar services in the area proposed to be annexed,

may be annexed to a county sanitation district if the directors find and determine that the additional territory will be benefited by annexation."

The land proposed to be annexed need not consist of contiguous parcels nor be contiguous with the county sanitation district when such land is within the same county.

When land proposed to be annexed is not within the same county such land shall be contiguous to the district."

The affected territory in this proposed annexation is located in Los Angeles County, which is the same county in which the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County is located, and the proposal therefore complies with Health and Safety Code § 4830.

The affected territory in this proposed annexation is contiguous to the existing boundaries of the District, is not within the boundaries of a County Sanitation District, or is within the boundaries of a district not performing similar services, and the sanitation district board of directors find and determine that the additional territory will be benefited by annexation, therefore complying with the contiguity provisions of the County Sanitation District Act of 1923 (Health and Safety Code § 4830).

As a special district annexation, the proposal has no impact on existing city-county boundaries, nor does it create islands or corridors of unincorporated territory.

g. Regional Transportation Plan:

The Southern California Associated Governments (SCAG) adopted its 2020-2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS) pursuant to Government Code § 65080. The closest highway to the annexation is part of the RTP and SCS's State Highway improved program. The closest highway in the RTP/SCS is the

Antelope Valley Freeway (14 Fwy), which is approximately 5,300 feet east of the affected territory.

h. Consistency with Plans:

The proposal is consistent with the existing City's General Plan designation of Specific Plan (Needham Ranch).

The proposal is consistent with the existing City's Specific Plan (Needham Ranch).

Pre-zoning is not a requirement for a special district proposal.

i. Sphere of Influence:

The affected territory is within the Sphere of Influence of the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County.

j. Comments from Public Agencies:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from public agencies or any resolutions raising objections from any affected agency.

k. Ability to Provide Services:

Although the affected territory is not currently served by the District, the area was included in the future service area that might be served by the District in its Sewer Facilities Plan. The District's future wastewater management needs were addressed in the 2015 Santa Clarita Joint Sewerage System Facilities Plan and EIR.

I. Timely Availability of Water Supplies:

There are no known issues regarding water supply or delivery. The affected territory is within the boundaries of the Newhall County Water District, which is the local water purveyor.

m. Regional Housing Needs:

As a special district annexation, the proposal will not affect any city, nor the county, in achieving their respective fair shares of the regional housing needs as determined by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG).

n. Comments from Landowners, Voters, or Residents:

Staff did not receive any significant comments from landowners, voters, or residents.

o. Land Use Designations

The proposal is consistent with the existing City's General Plan designation of Specific Plan (Needham Ranch).

The proposal is consistent with the existing City's zoning designation of Specific Plan (Needham Ranch).

p. Environmental Justice:

The owners of real property within the affected territory have requested, in writing, that the District provide off-site sewage disposal service. Property-owners of adjacent areas did not request such service, and/or were contacted by Sanitation District staff and were not interested in securing such service or did not respond. The proposal makes no representations on exclusions of peoples of any race, culture, income and/or national origins with respect to the location of public facilities and public services, to ensure a healthy environment for all people such that the effects of the pollution are not disproportionately borne by any particular populations or communities.

There are no Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities (DUCs) within or adjacent to the affected territory according to data obtained and extracted from the Census Bureau of the United States Department of Commerce 2016-2020 American Community Survey (ACS).

q. Hazard Mitigation Plan:

The City of Santa Clarita Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (approved September 2021) establishes the County's emergency policies and procedures in the event of a disaster and addresses allocation of resources and protection of the public in the event of an emergency.

The Safety Element of the General Plan for the City of Santa Clarita (adopted May 2022) addresses reduction of the potential risk of death, injuries, and economic damages resulting from natural and man-made hazards.

The affected territory is not within a Very High Fire Hazard Zone pursuant to maps published by the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (Cal Fire). The affected territory is not within the maps that identify State Responsibility Area. Both the City of Santa Clarita Hazard Mitigation Plan and the Safety Element of the General Plan include information relating to mitigation and management of wildfire and fire hazard severity zones.

Proposed Draft Budget for Fiscal Year 2025-26

Background

Government Code Section 56381 requires the Commission to adopt a proposed budget for the upcoming fiscal year (July 1 to June 30) by May 1st and a final budget by June 15th of each year. The Commission is further required to hold a noticed public hearing for both the proposed and final budget, and to distribute copies of the proposed and final budget to the County of Los Angeles, the eighty-eight (88) cities in Los Angeles County, and the fifty-one (51) independent special districts in Los Angeles County. The public hearing notice for the March 12, 2025 and April 9, 2025 meetings for the budget was posted in the Daily Journal on February 13, 2025.

Proposed Draft Budget

The Final Budget for the current fiscal year, FY 2024-25, was adopted at \$1,863,065 by the Commission on April 10, 2024. The Draft Budget for FY 2025-26 proposes an increase over last year's adopted budget, to \$2,020,814, allowing the Commission to retain consultants to prepare draft Municipal Service Reviews (MSR) and Sphere of Influence (SOI) Updates for consideration and adoption by the Commission.

Proposed Assessments

The overall Proposed Draft Budget for FY 2025-26 anticipates an increase of approximately 7.4% to the LAFCO apportionment collected in the current fiscal year (FY 2024-25).

The proposed budget includes a placeholder for Municipal Service Reviews (MSRs), increased costs from insurance rate premiums, scheduled salary increases affected by CPI and associated pension contributions as well as additional costs in various budgetary categories associated with historical and recent rate inflation increases.

Further explanation on budget categories of interest is included below.

Expenditures

There are three expenditure categories in the LAFCO Budget, consisting of Salaries and Benefits, Office Expenses, and Professional Services. Over the current year adopted budget (FY 2024-25), the Proposed Draft Budget includes an increase in Salaries and Benefits of approximately 2.7%, an increase in Office Expenses of approximately 5.2%, and an increase in Professional Services of approximately 48%. Overall, the proposed expenditures result in an 8.5% increase over last year's budget.

Employee Salaries (50001): The proposed amount accounts for current salaries as well as contractually-required cost of living increases for most employees (anticipated at this time to be three-percent), which will take effect July 1, 2025.

Employer Paid Pension Contributions (50015): As a LACERA participatory agency, LAFCO is subject to employer paid pension contribution rate increases. Although an increase is not anticipated in the upcoming fiscal year, contributions are a percentage of salaries, and as such this category was increased to reflect Employee Salaries. In addition, any accrued vacation and sick time cashouts are pensionable requiring employer paid pension contributions. These have also been accounted for in this budget category.

Accrued vacation and sick time cashout (50016): This budget line item accounts for staff's anticipated conversion of leave balances to compensation. The cashout of vacation and sick time reduces the Commission's Compensated Absences liability.

<u>Insurance (Health, Disability, Life) (50019)</u>: This account includes health, disability, and life insurance, and is subject to increases outside of the Commission's control.

<u>Payroll Taxes (50020)</u>: Payroll are a percentage of salaries. This budget line item was increased to reflect current salaries as well as contractually required cost of living increases which will take effect on July 1, 2025.

Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB)—Existing Retirees (50022): The proposed budget for FY 2025-26 reflects actual OPEB invoices for the current fiscal year.

Rent (50025): Fiscal Year 2025-26 represents a portion of the third year of the current office lease as well as the first half of the fourth year. The office lease schedule includes annual 3% increases to the base rent rate. In addition, to the rent, LAFCO is responsible for common area maintenance charges (CAMs). The proposed budget includes an anticipated 4% increase to CAMs after a decrease of approximately 12% in January 2025. This resulted in a nominal increase to the rent category.

<u>Property/Liability Insurance (50032):</u> Due to inverse condemnation claims, employment practice claims, and general increases in costs/services for claims experienced by our carrier, LAFCO's premium is increasing by approximately 18% in FY 2025-26 compared to the current fiscal year (2024-25).

Legal Notices (50052); Postage (50054); Printing/Copy Charges (50056); Miscellaneous/Other (50065): The proposed budget categories include charges for legal noticing, the amount of postage required for public hearing notices and costs for the use of expediated mail carrier services, copy charges, and CEQA filings with the County of Los Angeles Clerk-Recorder-Registrar Office were increased to account for the additional costs associated with Sphere of Influence Updates and Municipal Service Reviews commencing in FY 2025-26.

<u>Audit/Financial Statements (50077.2)</u>: The cost is consistent with the amount quoted for auditing services, approved previously by the Commission (February 12, 2025, Item 9.c.).

Municipal Service Reviews (MSRs) (50081): The proposed budget includes a placeholder amount, consistent with anticipated costs for consultants to prepare draft MSR and SOI Updates expected to occur in the coming fiscal year.

Revenues

<u>Filing Fees (40005):</u> As with each year's budget, the actual number of proposals (applications) filed is outside of staff control. The amount of fees included in this year's proposed budget is aligned with the high volume of fee generating proposals that have been filed with the office during the current fiscal year. The higher revenue is also attributable to the recent increases in the filing fees for boundary changes.

<u>Interest Income (40008)</u>: This account is used for interest income earned for funds held in the County of Los Angeles Treasury. The interest rate of return has been steadily declining since the beginning of the current fiscal year (FY 2024-25). Accordingly, the budget includes a lower amount than projected year end.

Local Agency Apportionment

With respect to the assessments upon the County of Los Angeles, the City of Los Angeles, the other eighty-seven (87) cities, and the fifty-one (51) independent special districts within the County of Los Angeles, staff proposes an increase of approximately 7.4% to LAFCO apportionment collected in the current fiscal year (2025-26). Over a five-year period (FY 2020-21 to FY 2025-26), the average increase in the local agency apportionment is 3.8% per year.

Staff notes that a significant component of the increased apportionment is the need to prepare MSRs and SOI Updates, which, for LAFCO, is both a statutory obligation and an unfunded State mandate. Other components of the increased apportionment include estimated salary increases, increased insurance premiums for employees and property/liability coverages, followed by professional services mostly related to auditing services.

Upon the Commission's approval of the annual budget (expected to occur April 9, 2025), the County Auditor-Controller allocates LAFCO apportionments upon public agencies based upon annual revenues reported in each agency's Annual Report submitted to the State Controller's Office. For this reason, and because reported revenues change on an annual basis, an individual agency's apportionment may change slightly, even in years when the overall LAFCO appointment remains unchanged.

<u>Conclusion:</u> The Proposed Draft Budget for FY 2025-26 would allow the Commission to fulfill its purpose and statutory obligations in the upcoming fiscal year.

Staff Recommendation:

- 1. Open the budget hearing, receive public comments, and close the budget hearing;
- 2. Approve the attached Proposed Draft Budget for Fiscal Year 2025-26;

- 3. Pursuant to Government Code Section 56381, direct staff to transmit the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2025-26 to the County of Los Angeles, as well as the eighty-eight (88) cities and fifty-one (51) independent special districts in Los Angeles County, for their comment; and
- 4. Set April 9, 2025, for hearing on adoption of the Recommended Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2025-26.

Request to Support Assembly Bill 259 (Rubio)

Staff is requesting that the Commission take a position supporting Assembly Bill 259 (AB 259), which Assemblymember Blanca Rubio introduced on June 19, 2024.

According to Capitol Track's summary of AB 259:

The Ralph M. Brown Act authorizes the legislative body of a local agency to use teleconferencing, as specified, and requires a legislative body of a local agency that elects to use teleconferencing to comply with specified requirements, including that the local agency post agendas at all teleconference locations, identify each teleconference location in the notice and agenda of the meeting or proceeding, and have each teleconference location be accessible to the public. Current law, until January 1, 2026, authorizes the legislative body of a local agency to use alternative teleconferencing if, during the teleconference meeting, at least a quorum of the members of the legislative body participates in person from a singular physical location clearly identified on the agenda that is open to the public and situated within the boundaries of the territory over which the local agency exercises jurisdiction, and the legislative body complies with prescribed requirements. Current law requires a member to satisfy specified requirements to participate in a meeting remotely pursuant to these alternative teleconferencing provisions, including that specified circumstances apply. Current law establishes limits on the number of meetings a member may participate in solely by teleconference from a remote location pursuant to these alternative teleconferencing provisions, including prohibiting such participation for more than 2 meetings per year if the legislative body regularly meets once per month or less. This bill [AB 259] would remove the January 1, 2026, date from those provisions, thereby extending the alternative teleconferencing procedures indefinitely.

According to the California Special District Association (CSDA) AB 259 Fact Sheet:

AB 259 eliminates the sunset provisions added to the Brown Act by Assembly Bill 2449 (Rubio, 2022), a bill that provided additional flexibility with alternative Brown Act meeting procedures observed in the event of a board member's absence in connection with a "just cause" or "emergency circumstances," allowing for these members so-affected to participate in the meeting remotely consistent with the process detailed in the bill.

Several special districts and other local agencies have utilized the procedures established by AB 2449, successfully facilitating remote participation for legislative policymakers that would otherwise been encumbered by illness, official travel, or medical emergency.

By removing the sunset, AB 259 preserves the additional flexibility for individual board members of local agencies looking to meet remotely to continue providing the public with essential services.

Absent legislative action, the alternative procedures established by AB 2449 will expire at the end of 2025.

AB 259 is pending before the Assembly Local Government Committee (ALGC). The bill will be scheduled for a hearing in the near future.

AB 259 affords LAFCO commissioners greater flexibility to attend Commission meetings remotely. Commissioners have utilized these provisions on several occasions, consistent with its provisions which limit its use to no more than two (2) meetings per year.

The CSDA is the sponsor of AB 259, and the Three Valleys Municipal Water District is a co-sponsor. CSDA and Three Valleys representatives have asked the Commission to support AB 259.

At the request of representatives of the Three Valleys Municipal Water District, the Commission took a "Support" position on AB 2449 (Assemblywoman Rubio's original bill from 2022) on March 9, 2022.

Recommended Action:

Staff recommends that the Commission:

1. Take a "SUPPORT" position on AB 259, authorize the Chair to sign letters documenting this position, and direct staff to convey this support to legislators and other stakeholders.
